




## Players hard at work on new musical, Curtains

## Come in from the cold to these new movies



The Super Bowl is still a whole week away, so why not occupy your weekend time with a trip to the movies? Science fiction, war and a unique presentation highlight this weekend's offerings.

### *I, Frankenstein*

Adam, the creation of Dr. Frankenstein, is still alive. After two hundred years he's survived due to a genetic anomaly. In a

dystopian era where a giant war is ongoing, Adam Frankenstein is caught in the middle of this giant war between groups of demons and gargoyle. With Frankenstein trapped in this epic battle what must be done to end it? "I, Frankenstein" picks up right where this crazy tale mixed with futuristic influences. This film is directed by Stuart Beattie, known for being behind the camera in *Pirates of the Caribbean: The Curse of the Black Pearl*, *GI Joe Rise of Cobra* and *Pirates of the Caribbean: Dead Man's Chest*. This stars Aaron Eckhart, Bill Nighy and Miranda Otto. If you like the Underworld series and ridiculous storylines you are going to love this one.

### *Lone Survivor*

When a Navy Seal and his team are sent on a mission to hunt down a monstrous al Qaeda leader they are given two choices: capture him dead or alive. That is the plot of *Lone Survivor*. In June 2005 during the most heated parts of the war Marcus Luttrell and his squad come upon mountain herders. After capturing them they

are forced to follow the rules of engagement and fight or else meet their end. The team is stranded to fight for themselves in this intense tale. Marcus Luttrell is played by Mark Wahlberg, with Taylor Kitsch as Michael Murphy and Emile Hirsch as Danny Dietz.

This story is an action war biography written by Marcus Luttrell himself, with help adapting to a screenplay by Peter Berg. Berg also directed the movie and has a few classic action movies under his belt. This movie is a smash hit in the box office and is going to be an enjoyable adventure based on a true life story. Plus it was nominated for two Oscars and won other awards as well. If you liked *Argo* but wanted more action, this could be the perfect combination.

### *Visitors*

This next movie is called *Visitors*. Directed by Godfrey Reggio, This film is aimed at revealing the powerful bond between humanity and technology. Reggio showcases the extreme effects this bond has when combined with the emotional extremes humans are known to endure. This movie stars Jeff Pope and Rob Tunstall. This film is a documentary with an experimental film style.

Godfrey Reggio is known for pioneering a style of filming that brings a poetic and powerful emotion into play. Reggio is interesting in that he spent 14 years in silence and prayer in order to become a monk. He has been working all of his life to help youth street gangs, lower class families and communities in need as well. This movie features no dialogue as well, so it is going to be for those looking for an obscure and beautiful mix of emotions conveyed with nothing but images and video. ## NFL looks to spice up Pro Bowl with new format

After several years of results more akin to basketball than football, the National Football League is making a drastic change to the end of the year Pro Bowl format. In each of the last two seasons the teams combined for better than 90 points, including a record 100 point outburst in 2012 when the AFC beat the NFC 59-41.

While all that scoring added some excitement, the general feeling is that the game has lost its luster. As a result the teams for the new style Pro Bowl are set for Sunday as team Rice and team Sanders picked their players on Wednesday.

This is the first year the fantasy draft has been set for the Pro Bowl and the fans have had mixed reviews. The last few Pro Bowls have had a lack of effort by the players resulting in scores of 63-35, 59-41 and last year's 55-41 NFC victory, so this is the NFL's attempt to try and bring attention and aggressiveness to the Pro Bowl again.

Key players for Team Rice, named for Hall of Famer Jerry Rice, are quarterbacks Andrew Luck, Cam Newton and Nick Foles along with

standout runners Eddie Lacy and Alfred Morris, receiver AJ Green, defensive end JJ Watt and linebacker Luke Kuechly.

The Deon Sanders led Team Sanders will feature Phillip Rivers, Alex Smith and Drew Brees at quarterback with running backs LeSean McCoy and Matt Forte, receivers Josh Gordon and Brandon Marshall and linebacker Robert Mathis.

The format marks a drastic change from the system used since 1971 when the AFL joined forces with the NFL which pitted the

best of the AFC against their NFC counterparts. From 1951 to 1970 the game featured the All-Stars from the league's two divisions. Originally created in 1939, the game featured the league champions against an all-star team. There was no game from 1943 to 1950 due to travel restrictions put in place during World War II.

This year's game, which will once again be held in Honolulu, Hawaii, will take place on Sunday at 7:30 pm on NBC.

# Raiders seek redemption in Section 3 showdown

The Section III Dual Meet Championship is just one day away. This

tournament, now celebrating its 26th anniversary, is something that Fulton has been familiar with. The first tournament was in 1989 and the Raiders brought home the title.

This was a just a preview of what was to come.

In just 25 tournaments, the Raiders have won an impressive 18 times. Rival Phoenix, has the second most titles with threes. Not only has Fulton won it multiple times, they have been runner ups four times.

Even though the Raiders have these impressive stats, they have only won it once in the past six seasons. From 1989-1996, the Raiders won eight in a row. Then from 2000-2007, they repeated it by winning another eight in a row. Some of the opponents the Raiders have beaten include, South Jefferson, Baldwinsville, and Lowville. Hopefully a streak like that can happen again shortly.

Wednesday night was a tough night for the Raiders, who lost to the Mexico Tigers. Not only was it their first league loss, they lost the league title. After many of the Raider wrestlers beat Mexico in tournaments, they fell short Wednesday. Many of the wrestlers were torn apart after this loss, but look at Saturday to rebound with a vengeance.

The Raiders are 20-2 on the season and face 12-3 Cicero-North Syracuse in the first round. The General Brown Lions, who are 17-0 are the number one seed, and the Central Valley Academy Thunder are 20-0 are ranked number two. If the Raiders make it to the



semifinals, they could face the Thunder.

With the best record in this tournament, the Raiders want to try and put another Section 3 Dual Meet title in the win column when the action begins at 10 am at Cicero-North Syracuse.

## Big Thursday for Raider bowling, basketball

Raider forces enjoyed a prosperous Thursday as the bowling teams remained unbeaten with identical 3-0 wins over Bishop Grimes and the girls basketball team clobbered Homer 41-15.

OHSL leader Mikayla Guernsey nailed a 250 game en route to a match high series of 680 as the Raider girls overwhelmed Bishop Grimes to charge to 10-0 on the season. Kendra Tryniski followed up with a high game of 233 en route to a 606 series as Fulton continued its season-long shutout streak. The Cobras were led by Alyssa Nalvor's 300 series.

The Raider boys were equally impressive in rolling past Bishop Grimes as Bryce Guernsey and Kyle Denson registered 643 and 637 pins respectively. Denson's 236 was high game for the match and Guernsey scored a 226 to help offset a 232 high game and 585 series from BG's Phil Zaccheo. With the win the Fulton boys also ran their mark to 10-0 on the season.

Lady hoopsters in runaway win

Hillary Clark led a seven girl scoring attack with 10 points while Sydney Gilmore, Nicole Hansen and Michaela Whitman added six points apiece as Fulton ran to a convincing win over visiting Homer. The Raiders jumped on top with a 15-1 first quarter barrage and never looked back, limiting the Trojans to just five first half points as Fulton led 24-9 at the break and 34-15 after three quarters. The win snapped a two game slide as the Raiders improved to 4-7 on the season. The girls host Fowler tonight at 6:30, hoping to duplicate a 55-40 December win on the Falcon home floor.

Macie Boyce and Hannah Casey scored four points apiece for a

Homer side that suffered through a season worst offensive showing and dipped to 7-7 with the lopsided loss.

In boys action tonight the Red Raider basketball and hockey teams are on the road as Coach Kimpland's hoopsters seek their fifth straight win in a 7 pm start at Fowler and the Fulton hockey team meets powerhouse West Genesee at Shove Park at 7:30.
