Late surge carries Raiders to senior night victory

Senior night proved to be everything the Raiders could have hoped for on Friday, and as a result Fulton will live to play another home

game this week after rallying past Jamesville-Dewitt 32-20. Two late touchdowns helped cap a 19-7 second half surge as the Raiders locked up second place in the OHSL American Division and a 6:30 pm Friday night date against Carthage, a stunning 31-0 loser at Whitesboro in the OHSL National Division battle for second place.

Fulton ran roughshod over the Rams while rolling up 337 yards on the ground including big efforts from junior Quinton Jackson and sophomore Mike Peck. Jackson torched J-D for 164 yards on 22 carries including a pair of touchdowns and Peck averaged 14 yards per carry while gaining 114 yards in just eight attempts.

Quarterback Cody Green added 51 yards on four carries including a touchdown and was an impressive 11 for 15 through the air to add another 130 yards to the Red Raider total. Dallas Bradley hauled in six passes for 75 yards and Chris Jones made five grabs for 55 yards including a touchdown as Fulton finished the regular season at 4-3 overall and 3-1 in league play. Erasing an early 13-0 deficit, J-D took a 20-19 lead into the final quarter as Joseph Murphy connected on scoring strikes of 62 and 25 yards to Ben Wipper. But from there the Raiders took control to score the final 13 points of the game for their first win over the Red Rams since a season opening 18-6 triumph in 2008.

In other Class A action Oswego locked down the final American Division playoff spot with a 28-14 win over Cortland while Indian River clobbered Watertown 50-12 to finish a perfect 7-0 regular season. This Friday's opening round playoff match-ups will find Oswego at Indian River and Carthage at Fulton while East Syracuse-Minoa hosts New Hartford and Jamesville-Dewitt is at Whitesboro.

Travis Eberly and Mike Cirusuolo combined for 279 rushing yards and three touchdowns, including a 71 yard bolt from Cirusuolo, to lead Whitesboro to a lopsided win over visiting Carthage on Friday night. The battle for second place in the Class A National Division proved to be a one-sided affair despite 137 yards on 22 carries from Comet standout Josh Capers.
