Each team comes into the contest with something to prove, and they will face off looking to demonstrate who is the better squad.

Fulton has won six straight homecoming games coming into this Friday and they will look to keep this momentum going and come out with their seventh straight against Oswego. This Friday's game will be about pride, honor and dignity as the Raiders search for their first win of the season and attempt to avoid their first 0-5 start in recent memory. "Our whole team needs to step it up big this week, it's homecoming and senior night. We cannot afford another loss," stated running back Donald Watson.

Stopping the Buccaneer ground game will be the first order of business for Fulton, as the Bucs have rushed for over 1,000 in their first four games. Josh McRae has carried the ball

No place like Homecoming for a Raider victory

Looking back on their homecoming students will always remember those pre-game bonfires, ecstatic pep rallies, as well as the final showdown then celebration of the teams last home game and dance.

The history of Homecoming in Fulton is marked with tradition, spirit and pride that brings our community together. Past alumni come back to see their home town team, the Fulton Red Raiders.

At the center of all the face paint, feathers and wacky weeklong attire for Spirit Week is the football game. And in recent years, Fulton fans have had plenty to cheer about. Dating back to the 1997 Homecoming, the overall record of the Raiders is a glorious 12-1, including six straight victories since falling 16-12 to Camden in 2003. The team has also

outscored their opponents 91-33 in just the last three-homecoming battles.

In that span only two of the games have been close, with a 32-31 win over Carthage in 1997 and an 8-6 triumph against Fowler in 2008 joining the '03 clash as bona fide nailbiters. The Raiders have broken the 40-point plateau four times in the past 13 years and surpassed the half-century mark in 2004 when they roughed up Fowler 52-6.

The Falcons have been the fall guys on three occasions, standing as Fulton's Homecoming opponent in 2002, 2004 and 2008 while East Syracuse-Minoa (1998 and 2001) and Jamesville-Dewitt (2005, 2009) have twice been victims during the current 12-1 Raider run.

This year as the Red Raiders host historic rival Oswego Buccaneers they look to keep the win streak alive. Their chance to do that will commence at 6:30 p.m. tonight when the two sides collide in Fulton.

84 times for 313 yards while Kyle Lamb has 68 carries for 333 for a 4.9 yard average per carry. Miguel Vazquez has also been a workhouse with 56 carries for 163 yards while Chris Pike averages 5.4 yards per carry with 30 attempts for 161 yards. But despite these lofty totals, the Bucs have been unable to convert rushing yardage into points, scoring just 34 total points in an 0-4 start.

Getting quick off the mark will be another key for the Raiders tonight, as the Bucs have yielded at least two touchdowns in the first quarter of all four games and 134 points in the first half of four lopsided defeats. Cortland ran to a 20-7 first quarter lead and Indian River out-pointed Oswego 20-0 in the opening 12 minutes of play, a formula that Fulton will be hoping to copy when the two teams meet tonight. Running back Don Watson will be looking to add to his rushing total after gaining 350 yards in 53 attempts for a 6.6 yards per carry while quarterback Brett Williams has added 124 yards on 21 carries for a 5.9 average each time he runs with the ball. Williams will also look to the sky after completing 23 of 47 for 252 yards including four connections apiece to Max Fobes and Tyler Terramigi.

It'll be a big test and challenge this Friday for the Raiders to overcome their losing streak. Winning is contagious, and what better way to start the streak than the weekend of homecoming against a team who shares the same record? With the added incentives of the pep-rally occurring and Senior Night happening, the Fulton spirit circulating the halls, and the support from

I would love to see Donovan McNabb go into Philly and destroy the birds. But after watching the Redskins these past few weeks, it's not going to happen.


