In 1919 President Wilson recognized the significance of this day with a speech in which he said, "'To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service...'"

It was not until 1938 that this date was distinguished as a national holiday, meant to dedicate a day to celebrating not only those who fight for our country but the goal of a peaceful world. In this year President Eisenhower issued the Veteran's Day Proclamation to ensure widespread celebration of this holiday.

However, in today's day and age many do not take time on this day to appreciate those who have fought and are fighting for our rights. Most citizens know a war veteran, taking the day to ask them about their war experience would surely remind them that their sacrifice was not for nothing.

In June 1968 the Uniform Holiday Bill was passed in an attempt to make all federal holi-

days on Fridays to encourage holiday travel. Regardless, Veteran's Day would not conform because society cannot change the accomplishments of a date just for the convenience of others.

## Missed opportunity for SU


The now 6-3 Syracuse Orange had a chance to beat the Louisville Cardinals and secure a bowl game, but they just could not get the job done last Saturday at the Dome. At the half, the Orange had a 17-14 lead, and things were looking great for them.

That all started to change in the third quarter. It started with a sure touchdown dropped pass by receiver Alec Lemon which deflated the offense, and the defense followed, then the mistakes began happening. Incomplete passes,

missed tackles, poor blocking. The Cardinals and their first year head coach, Charlie Strong, outplayed the Orange, and seemed like they wanted the win more.

After turning the program in a full 360-degree turn, head coach Doug Marrone is looking to for a seventh win, to ensure the winning season, and the bowl game. Rutgers, UConn and Boston College all remain in the path of the Orange, but if Syracuse can beat just one, they get the chance to play in a bowl game.

## Airport security: how secure is it?

When one thinks of an airport terminal, two thoughts come to mind: the long hours spent waiting for the flights, and the heightened security. The list seems to grow longer and longer each day of banned items, as printer cartridges larger than 16 ounces in weight were recently added to the list.

With all the security involved, one would believe the identities of passengers would be confirmed and identified, with zero percent error in the process. This was believed to be true until a recent flight from Hong Kong to Canada on October 29. The Chinese man, whose name has not been released to the public yet, is believed to have used a people smuggling ring to get across the borders.

A people smuggling ring is a group of people who provide an individual with a passport that shows characteristics similar to a nation's cultural profile. As the investigation is still underway, with no end in sight, the man is being detained in a prison located in Vancouver. He is there because he requested refugee protection, and will remain there until the investigation concludes. This incident raises an individual question about just how safe international air travel is, as well as just who is allowed to enter our native country.

One really begins to question their safety and well being if a man from a rural part of China can almost fool the world.

If the bucks smell the estrous scent, they will come in fast. If the hunter is not ready, he or she may not have time to either draw a bow or get a gun in position, hunters


