

# Cody's last swim: a fond farewell to a friend

Although I tore my ACL about two weeks ago, that is not where my heart has been. I have a dog who is 12 years old, a Chesapeake Bay Retriever, and she goes by the name of Cody. My family has owned Cody since she was a young puppy, as we took her into the Shannon household mere weeks into her life. Unfortunately, the young pup became an old hound, and will no longer age beyond Saturday. About a month ago, Cody was diagnosed with cancer and the disease affected her facial area, although it did not cause the dog any pain.

Cody has been one of my closest companions for years now, as we have shared both a house and a duck blind. My dad began hunting when I was about eight, so I was a tad young to be swinging a shotgun through the skies. However, a strong interest in hunting was developed, and I spent a solid portion of my weekend mornings waking up early and accompanying my father and my puppy through the darkness and freezing temperatures to spend hours in the back of the blind playing Pokemon, with the volume silenced to prevent the unnecessary scare of incoming waterfowl. My dad would shoot, and Cody would swim into the chilled waters and come back with a duck. I would admire the bird for hours until the blind was vacated, and then for the whole ride home as well.

As I became of age, I began to aid my father in the quest to land birds in the blind. Being woken up before sunrise was a daunting task for a 12-year old boy, but it was worth it when Cody saw the camou-

flage come out. The dog would hover around you, darting between your legs with each step you took due to pure excitement. More time was spent shooing the pup away than actually putting on clothes to stay warm.

As the ducks flew in over the years, shots rang out, and birds fell to the water. My father and Cody would exit the blind, and she would retrieve the fallen birds. I would watch from the railing as a brown

head would navigate the waters and a mouth would wrap around some type of waterfowl. The duck would be brought back, and hung on a leader with all of its other fallen comrades. Every duck brought back to the blind meant another time when I could watch my close companion strengthen the bonds we formed.

Outside of the blind, Cody also served as a member of the family. Countless nights were spent sleeping at the top of the stairs, between all of the rooms, as if to say "If you want them, you're going through me." This protective trait was exemplified on many pizza men, as a knock on the door would be heard, and a brown body would leap into the sheet of metal separating dinner and dog.

With Cody's cancer affecting her face, a tumor of considerable size was growing on her brow, causing her to become blind in one eye, and soon to be blind in the other. Cody lost her appetite and began occasionally bleeding from the nose, two signs the Vet indicated that the end would soon be upon her. The dreaded moment was coming ever closer, and my family knew it.

Two Sundays ago, I went out to the lake with my father and Cody, knowing full well this could be one of the last times I could ever see the pup in action. The ducks were not flying, so the morning was spent telling stories of the blind as well as trying to recover from the heavy emotional tolls. Neither hunter wanted to show the other he was crying, but rather tried to laugh it off. This strategy worked for a few hours, allowing a duck to swim into the decoys from the center of the lake. Without saying a word, my father let me know the shot was mine. Even the slightest movement alerted Cody to a possible retrieve, and the 'puppy' looked through the opening, following the duck in. Her eyes were focused like they were on her first hunt several years ago.

The duck was a Merganser, a duck that eats primarily fish. Cody retrieved the duck flawlessly, and brought the duck into the blind, and passed it on to the shooter. My father and I lost all control at this point. Tears streamed down our faces as we patted each other on the back and petted the dog we loved so much. We knew we raised the dog right, and nothing was more evident than this during these moments.

As the duck swam in, millions of thoughts ran through my head. Normally, my father would scare the duck up to make the shot more challenging, but we both knew Cody needed this. It seemed like hours before the duck made it within range. The Merganser finally swam inside the decoys, and I knew what to do. My thoughts raced around my brain, thinking "If I miss, this could be the last duck Cody could ever see," and "This bird should be flying." I squeezed the trigger with one final thought in my head:

"This was never about the hunt. This duck is for Cody."

## Anticipation is high for Call of Duty: Black Ops

Ask any gamer in the school what they are going to do on the upcoming long weekend you will probably get some mention of Call Of Duty Black Ops. The seventh installment in the Call Of Duty franchise, Black Ops takes players to the cold war era as elite commandos who operate under the radar.

Not much is known about the game due to Treyarch Studios maintaining secrecy to add to the mystery of this game, which will hit the stores on Tuesday, Nov. 9. Treyarch is not new to the Call of Duty franchise as they have made three other games COD 2, COD 3, and Call Of Duty: World At War. Although these games are not as famous as Infinity Wards Call Of Duty 4 Modern Warfare, and Call Of Duty Modern Warfare 2 they still have a huge fan base and are enjoyed by players of all ages.

Modern Warfare 2 broke several world records relating to media sales such as most pre order sales and amount of sales in five days with 550 million dollars made in less than a week. Black Ops looks to break Modern Warfare 2's record of most copies of a video game sold and most amount of money made on a

video game, which will be no easy feat due to MW2's astonishing sales figures.

What is known about Black Ops is that it will take place in the cold war era and be based on military coverup operations. Though not officially confirmed, there is leaked footage on the Internet that the ever-popular Nazi Zombies mode will be back. Black Ops also features new customization options for the player to utilize such as custom sights and attire, whereas in the past a player could only choose their weapons paintjob and choose one attachment from a very limited list.

Some new features that the new game brings to the field are the use of a credit system to unlock weapons, perks, and kill streaks, and the addition of new game modes such as wager matches where players can bet their virtual currency on who will win a match and then they play the match to hopefully earn more currency than they wagered. The leaked footage of the zombie's mode shows several new maps such as the Pentagon and an opera theater and a new set of characters such as JFK, Fidel Castro and Richard Nixon. Call Of Duty Black Ops is set to come out guns blazing on November 9, 2010.

## Jail time is over for 'lil Wayne "Best rapper alive"

After serving time for a nearly eight month sentence, rap artist Dwayne "Lil' Wayne" Carter was scheduled for release during the day on Thursday, November 4 from New York's Rikers Island jail. Charged with gun possession and a sentence that has lasted since early March, Lil' Wayne's freedom brings him back home with a hopeful future including a recording career still in front of him.

Despite being jailed, many would see Lil' Wayne fortunate with the completion of his ninth career album, "I Am Not a Human Being" released back in September for the super-star's 28 birthday.

Although many expect him to come back to the music industry hot, much of the last month Lil' Wayne has spent time in the doghouse for a punishment during confinement in early October. After being caught with both an MP3 charger and headphones in his cell, Carter was placed in punitive segregation; 23 hours of solitary confinement and one hour of recreation, as well as facing several minor set backs according to Rikers employees. This punishment had no effect on his expected release date.

With rumors spinning about parties and performances, Lil' Wayne's release is already sparking interest. A flight home to his anxious record company in Miami, followed by an on stage performance with artist Drake on Saturday in Vegas are first up for this notorious rapper.

**Jonas Brothers: talent runs in the family**

When Paul and Denise Jonas welcomed their sons, Paul Kevin II, Joseph, and Nicholas, they had no

idea that a few short years after they moved to Wyckoff, New Jersey, their boys would be some of the most recognizable faces on the planet, and heart-throbs for teen girls everywhere. They were just trying to raise their boys the best that they could.

The story starts with Nick, who was discovered humming and singing random little songs while his mother was getting her hair done, and a woman told his mother that they needed to get him an agent, and that is how Nick Jonas's Broadway career began. He acted in several musicals, playing Kurt in the ever popular Sound of Music, Chip in Beauty and the Beast, Gavroche in Les MisÈrables, (in 2010, Nick returned to Les MisÈrables as Marius), Tiny Tim in A Christmas Carol, and Little Jake in Annie Get Your Gun.

In 2002, Nick and his father wrote the song "Joy to the World (A Christmas Prayer)" and Nick performed it on a charity album of Broadway stars singing their favorite Christmas songs, and Columbia Records got wind of the song. Contracts were drawn up and soon, the youngest Jonas was signed on to Columbia with a solo project. While his album titled Nicholas Jonas was being recorded, he and his brothers were hard at work, writing songs together, including one of their hit songs, "Please Be Mine." The president of the record company heard the song, and he decided to sign the brothers as a group project.

And with that, the Jonas Brothers were born.



In 2005, the boys were already on tour, opening up for smaller acts like Jump Five, the Backstreet Boys, Kelly Clarkson, Aly & AJ, and the Cheetah Girls, and they had also started the process of writing their

first studio album It's About Time. Their first single, "Mandy" was released in December of 2005, and it reached number four on MTV's TRL.

In 2006, their first album was released, but it was a "limited release" due to the fact that only 50,000 copies were sent around the country. By that time Sony, the band's lead promoter, had no further interest in sponsoring them, and the band began to discuss switching labels, which they did in February of 2007.

In February of 2007, the brothers changed labels to Hollywood Records, based out of Los Angeles, California, and they moved their family from their home base of New Jersey to California, where the boys started writing and recording their second studio album, Jonas Brothers. The album went platinum in March of 2008, and they began writing and recording their third studio album, which also went platinum, A Little Bit Longer.

On June 15, 2009 their fourth studio album, Lines, Vines and Tryin' debuted at the number one spot on the Billboard charts, selling over 300,000 copies in its first weekend. After the album was sold, the brothers announced they would be going on a world tour that started

## Syracuse hopes to remain on a roll

After years of suffering, the Syracuse University football team seems to finally be catching some breaks.

After winning three away Big East games in a row, including one against then #20 West Virginia, and one against defending Big East champion Cincinnati, the Syracuse Orangemen look strong heading into the month of November. The now 6-2 Orange need two more wins to make a bowl bid, and with three home games remaining, this unimaginable dream is alive.

Syracuse's offense was efficient this past Saturday, as they took down the Bearcats 31-7. Junior quarterback Ryan Nassib got things rolling after finishing off an 80-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown pass. Although he did not score, Delone Carter had his third 100-yard rushing game of the season, moving him up on the Syracuse all time rushing list.

Syracuse's defense is also looking strong, holding the leagues top offense to seven points and only 277 total yards while producing three turnovers that led to 17 points for the Orange. Second year head Coach Doug Marrone has really turned the program around, and Syracuse now looks to play in its first bowl game since 2004, a game they lost to Georgia Tech.
