Desks to be eliminated in cost-cutting measure

With effects of a rough economy sweeping across the nation the time has come for serious change around G. Ray Bodley High School. With budget cuts creeping higher and higher something has got to go to fulfill such a tight money policy. Fulton City School District is the first noted school in the Central New York Region to resort to a "Clipboard-REWARD Education."

A program founded by Ishkick Powpow, an African monk from the country of Morocco, "Clipboard-REWARD Education" has developed efficient, money saving education internationally for the last twenty years. This program allows the school to auction off desks, lab tables and expensive work stations in order to save money and earn money while keeping focus on a strong education. Instead of desks students will be required to use a clipboard for class work during school.


teams are just too important to the kids these days. I don't have the heart to sit here and let that happen," an anonymous source close to the decision commented. "In addition, with desks out of our way we'll have so much room for activities."

Teachers throughout the school have accepted the program quite easily. To help adapt to the new policy, teachers will now receive twice their monthly bonus to go along with the annual teacher lounge upgrades. Mr. Non-Sensical, a well-respected teacher at G.R.B., was de-

lighted to hear about the decision to lose the desks. "I think it will really help for a more hands-on open classroom learning environment. Students will pay better attention while us teachers will have no worries of texting under the desk every bell, not to mention the raise will enable me to buy another ski villa in Vail, Colorado."

He also noted that the removal of desks will come in handy when class sizes expand due to the loss of teaching positions within the district. "I wasn't sure how I would pack them all in my room, but now I can probably handle 70-80 kids per bell, just like Bill Gates recommended."

While many will stand by this decision, there are always those who disagree. Several parent groups have already objected, saying that having desks could in fact be beneficial in the classroom. Senior parent Greg Fobes was one of the numerous parents who felt they have a voice in the decision of the "Clipboard-REWARD Education" program decision in Fulton Schools. "As a father and member of our community I demand an explanation for all of this." He went on questioning, "Where do you put your pencil? How do you have enough space to do work efficiently when you have just a small clipboard for workspace the entire day?"

While parents argue, questions have been answered and the process is well underway. Students may use either their ear to place a writing utensil upon, while two clipboards may be used for those who seek to maximize work space. Students may also purchase a chair of their own to bring to school at their own risk, a reminder that students will also lose chair privileges. (Chairs will also be sold to strengthen the budget to the "Who cares about the Chairs? Foundation") The school will not be accountable for lost, broken or stolen chairs.

Officials are pleased with the final decision and hope to keep making forward progress for the future. Desks will be moved out at the beginning of early May and the "Desk-Free campus" will be established soon after. The schools thank you for your support and hope to see you on the floor in no time.




