Raider boys battle to scoreless standoff

Fulton and Jamesville-Dewitt were fit to be tied on October 1 when the two teams battled to a scoreless draw. The first half for the Raiders started off slowly with little possession in the first 20 minutes. The next twenty minutes the Raiders really put it together connecting with each other as one, and opportunities began to fall into place.

Austin Wild and Carlos Feliciano connected in the Red Rams six yard box, Wild playing a one-time ball back to Carlos for a shot that was just deflected wide for a corner. At the start of the second half both teams came out of the gates firing shots and fighting for the win. Raider keeper RJ Barrow made an amazing save with his face to keep the Raiders in the game. The second half came to an end with a draw the raiders would now prepare for their first 10 minute overtime, sudden death.

During the first over time the boys fought hard but couldn't put one in on the Rams, while Fulton's stellar defenders Shawn Walberger, David Tallents, Anthony Anderson and Garret Roik stood tall to keep the Rams at bay. The second overtime started with great intensity for both teams striving for a goal to win the game. Late in the second overtime a cross was put in by Jeff Waldron to Carlos Feliciano, who got a head on the ball and put it just wide of the goal. The overtime came to an end and the Raiders were forced to settle for a scoreless draw with Jamesville-Dewitt. The team faced Mexico on Thursday, looking to improve on a 3-5-2 record.

Into the Wild:

Outdoor seasons in full swing

Now that September has ended and October has begun bow hunting season is open and duck season is on the way. As was the case in 2012, bow season started on October 1 rather than the traditional October 15. Opening day for Northern Zone duck season is this Saturday, October 5 so there will be many hunters out this weekend.

These past two seasons for deer have produced high numbers of deer due to the easier winters. Bow season continues until November 15, and with fifteen extra days, the higher numbers of deer, and the cold weather predicted all signs are that this bow season is going to be a good one.

The duck numbers remain high although they are down six percent from last year's record high number which was an estimated, 48.6 million ducks. There is also added excitement for the two-bird limit for canvasbacks, and goldeneyes, the Atlantic Flyway's fourth most plentiful duck just behind Mallards, as they were up significantly in the eastern survey. Recently, numerous ducks and geese have been reported in Northern regions of New York and Vermont migrating south. With some good calling and a nice spread of decoys, waterfowl hunters should expect a good start to the season.

If you can only hunt small game, squirrel, grouse, rabbit and crow are open. Of course if you are not a hunter, the great thing about living in Central New York in the fall is the Salmon run. There have been high numbers of Salmon and Trout in the Salmon River as well as in the Oswego River in Oswego. There is always something to do outdoors in the fall, so pack up the gear and head out!

His body was discovered by Hotel workers at the Fairmount Hotel when Monteith failed to check out of his room. When the medics originally checked him over, they stated that his death was due to unknown reasons. Two days following his death, it was discovered in an autopsy that his passing was due to a mix of toxins, heroin and alcohol. His death was ruled as an accidental overdose.

Co-Star, had said that he once had a past with drugs, but he had just recently kicked his addiction. An insider informed *Life & Style* that Lea Michelle blames herself for his death, because, "she did everything in her power to make him want to be sober and clean." On July 17, Monteith's body was cremated, and his family said their final goodbyes.

Last Thursday night, *Glee* aired their fifth season, a week later than planned, due to mourning. On October 10, a tribute is planned to be aired on Fox at 9pm titled "The Quarterback" for Monteith. Tune in to mourn his short and untimely death, and remember his name, not as a drug addict, but as a hard-worker, and the actor who brought many families together once a week to enjoy a great show.

The Sweet Side of Life:

Try out these tasty coffeecake muffins

Welcome to a new column in RaiderNet Daily that focuses on making delicious desserts that complement the seasons. I compile them from what I have found on the internet and from cookbooks. Some of the upcoming recipes are also family recipes that you can try.

In this edition, you will learn how to make Cinnamon-Sugar Crusted Coffee Cake Muffins. I hope you like what you see and attempt to make some of these recipes on your own. Enjoy!

Cinnamon-Sugar Crusted Coffee Cake Muffins

Yield: 12 Muffins

Serving Size: 1 Muffin

These taste just like an old-fashioned doughnut with cinnamon and sugar. Be prepared to make more immediately because they'll be gone in no time. .

Ingredients

2 cups all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon nutmeg

3/4 teaspoon cinnamon

1/4 cup vegetable oil

2/3 cup granulated sugar

1 egg

1 cup milk

For the Cinnamon Sugar Topping:

1/4 cup butter, melted

1/3 cup granulated sugar

1 Tablespoon cinnamon

Instructions

1. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Whisk together the flour, baking powder, salt, nutmeg, and cinnamon.



2. In a separate large bowl, whisk together the oil, sugar, egg and milk.

3. Add the flour mixture to the oil and milk mixture and stir just until combined.

4. Coat a standard 12-cup muffin pan well with nonstick cooking spray and divide the batter evenly among the cups.

5. Bake for 15 to 18 minutes, until a toothpick inserted into the center of one muffin comes out clean.

6. Run a knife around the sides of each of the muffins and shake them out of the pan while still hot. Place them on a wire rack while you assemble your toppings.

7. In a small, shallow bowl, melt the butter.

8. In another small, shallow bowl, combine the sugar and cinnamon.

9. Dip each muffin first in the butter, then into the cinnamon-sugar, swirling to coat all sides. Let cool for a few minutes on a wire rack so that the butter and sugar can harden slightly before serving.

These are best when eaten warm, fresh from the oven, but consuming them at any point on the day you make them is just as lovely.
