College representatives from St. John Fisher (10 am) and Albany College of Pharmacy and health sciences (1 pm) will be in the guidance office today to meet with interested students.


Raiders bow in Class A volleyball final

Season long trends were continued on Tuesday, and unfortunately for the Fulton girls volleyball team that spelled defeat in the Class A championship match.

For the second straight year the Raiders dropped a 3-0 decision to nearby Oswego as the Bucs claimed their second straight Class A crown in a 3-0 whitewash. The 10-7 side will now face a formidable task on Saturday when they take on defending state champion Burnt Hills at 2 pm at Cicero-North Syracuse.

As had been the case all season, it as feast or famine for both teams. For the eighth time in ten victories Oswego claimed a 3-0 triumph while Fulton fell 3-0 for the sixth time in nine losses of a 9-9 campaign.

The Buccaneers prevailed 25-16 in the opening game and then battled to a 25-21 victory to take a 2-0 advantage in the best of five format. But unlike Friday when Fulton was able to rally from an 0-2 hole, there was no comeback on Tuesday as Oswego scored an emphatic 25-12 victory to come away with the Class A title.



Tech. talk:

Battlefield 4 is back and bigger than ever

Electronic Arts recently just released their fourth installation of the *Battlefield* franchise. This game's early scene includes putting down an attack dog by punching it, which gamers believe to be a jab at Activision's *Call of Duty* franchise. "Battlefield 4 can go toe-to-toe with any *Call of Duty*," says Aaron Morales, author of the article "Video game review: Can *Battlefield 4* take on *Call of Duty*." "However you can't but help that it had aimed even higher."

Like most first person shooter games the campaign is extremely loud on explosions and incredibly short, which leaves the question why even bother having the campaign if no real work is going to go into it. This has been a question of gamers for years which will never have a solid answer.



Multiplayer, the back bone of all first person shooters, is bigger than ever in *Battlefield 4* with eight game modes, ten maps, four character classes, plenty of vehicles and hundreds of weapons that will leave the gamers asking for more. Like in the previous installations of the *Battlefield* series buildings can still be destroyed, however Electronic Arts brought this to the next level by adding events that can cause the map to be flooded, burned by oil, and much more. This will keep gamers enticed and on their toes with unprecedented levels of unpredictability.

Battlefield 4 is sure to have a mix of reviews coming soon enough as players get to play it, but overall this game looks like any other first person shooter with a few new aspects.

This is a "great step forward from the same old first person shooter of just shooting everything that moves," says Aaron Morales, this is true as the environment is now becoming a factor, not just what weapons you have.

So all in all this game is just a new installment of the *Battlefield 3* but with the environment making a bigger role in the online gameplay.
