Raiders run, jump to sectional positions

The Raider indoor track teams turned in a pair of successful meets. On January 14th and 15th, the Raiders ran in the Bob Grieve Memorial Invite. Then on January 21st and 23rd, they competed in the Fred Kirschenheiter Memorial Invite.

Leading off the Raiders for the Bob Grieve Invite was senior Connor Aldasch who competed in the 55 meter hurdles, his specialty event. Aldasch had already qualified for sectionals and ran a 9.04, placing 7th out of 27. Next was the 4x800 team composed of Kenny Deloff, Geoffry Michaels, Jimmy Martin, and Bailey Lutz. The team ran a season best 9:33 and placed 9th out of 18 teams.

In triple jump Mike Holcomb, placed eighth out of 27 jumpers. To finish off the night shot putter Nick Reitz threw for 40 feet and 2 inches, good enough for 13th.

On the girls side, Erica Pawlewicz led the Lady Raiders in the running events. Pawlewicz finished 16th out of 47 and qualified in the 600 meter run with a 1:51. In the field events there were more good performances as Makenzie Loomis jumped a personal best 15-foot-5 in the long jump. Finally, Shannon Zych jumped 4-foot-8 in the high jump, which put in her in ninth place.

At the Fred Kirschenheiter Memorial Invite, there were more successes for the Raiders and Lady Raiders. Turning in another strong

performance in the 55 meter hurdles was Aldasch, who ran 9.08. In the 1000m run, two Raiders qualified for sectionals as Bailey Lutz ran a 2:49 and finished 16th, while Jimmy Martin ran 2:46 and finished 9th. Scoring points in an indoor meet is very hard, but Mike Holcomb managed to score seven. In the 300 meter run, he finished sixth and in the triple jump he finished in third. For the girls Pawlewicz finished 26th and qualified for sectionals in the 300 meters, and in shot put Jessica Race threw 23-foot-2 and placed 33rd.

Many athletes are now gearing up for sectionals, which will take place on February 4.

After 20 weeks of a very interesting and unusual season, the Super Bowl has finally arrived. Super Bowl XLVIII features the top two teams in the league, the Denver Broncos and the Seattle Seahawks. Both teams were 13-3 in the regular season and had only one home loss. The Broncos are led by the veteran quar-

terback Peyton Manning, who is having one of the best seasons of all time, and the Seahawks are led by sophomore quarterback Russell Wilson.

This year's Super Bowl is at Giants Stadium in East Rutherford, New Jersey. It is projected to be mid 30s' which could make it one of the coldest Super Bowl's of all time. In the past three years, these two teams have played each other three times. Denver won the game in 2011 and Seattle won the last two games by more than 20 points. When both these teams made it the playoffs, their road to the Super Bowl was not easy. Seattle won by eight and six points, while Denver won by seven and ten points.

Denver is currently the favorite to win the game, but it was originally Seattle, so it should be close. Denver has the best passing and overall offense in the league. The big reason why they are so dominant is because of Manning. Going into the postseason, he had 5,477 passing yards and an NFL record 55 touchdown passes. Not only did he throw for a lot, he threw accurately as well, completing more than 68% of his passes. Manning has had great receivers to throw to like Wes Welker, Demaryius Thomas and Julius Thomas. The Broncos rushing game was average but, Knowshon Moreno rushed

for 1000 yards and 10 touchdowns. The Broncos weakness is their defense, but they still can win games.

Seattle is an overall young team and this is their second ever Super Bowl appearance. The Seahawks are led by a 5-foot-11 25 year old, something very unusual to see in the Super Bowl. Even though Wilson does not have much experience, he is still a very good quarterback. Just like Manning, Wilson was very accurate, completing 63% of his passes. Unlike his rival, the Seahawks QB can run the ball effectively. He ran for over 500 yards in the regular season. Seattle has the fourth best rushing game behind Marshawn Lynch. Lynch has been known to go into "beast mode" for tearing apart defenses. Speaking about defenses, Seattle has the best in the league. The number one defense goes up against the number one offense. After the game ending interception against the 49ers, it is easy to see how good the Seahawks defense is.

This is going to be a hard game to predict as it is the two number one seeds. We will find out if offense or if defense wins games. 
the Cricket world cup.

As of 2011, there were an estimated 300,000 Afghan-Americans living in this country. While 30,000 of them live in Northern Virginia, 65,000 members of this group live in the San Francisco Bay Area. Fremont, California, is home to the largest Afghan-American population in America.
