

Talent show raises nearly \$2000 for charities

The G. Ray Bodley High School HOPE Club has done it again, putting together another amazing night of entertainment on Wednesday at the annual Bodley's Got Talent talent show. And by the time the 21 acts had performed nearly \$2000 had been raised for a trio of charities.

Officially there were five winning performances, but in reality everyone was a winner, including Make a Wish, Volunteers for Peace and ARISE. Sophomore MyKenzie Finch claimed first prize for her powerful rendition of "Skinny Love," while the fast dancing duo of Angela Paul and Ashley Grey showed off their Irish step-dancing skills to finish second overall. Third place went to the trio of Kylie Jacklett, Justina Race and Stephen Heywood for their entertaining, Broadway-esque "She Falls Asleep."

Also claiming prizes were drummer Scott DePuy as the most unique, while BGT veterans Neal Burke and Justin Purtell shared the title of audience favorite. For Burke it was his fourth consecutive year among the winners as the senior brought the crowd to life with his rendition of "Friend Like Me" from Disney's *Aladdin*. "It's been great being up there and I only wish I could be up there a lot more," Burke said of his experience. "What I like most about it is pleasing the crowd."

The Godzilla Files

King Ghidorah ranks as one of toughest foes

Hello and welcome to another Godzilla Kaiju Class. As the release of the new Godzilla film draws closer, many wonder if the new monster designs will live up to Toho's many monsters. Today's monster is a classic Godzilla foe and is considered by many to be Godzilla's arch enemy. The three-headed dragon and the King of Terror, King Ghidorah.

Appearance

King Ghidorah is a golden dragon with three heads, a pair of bat-like wings, two tails and a "voice like a bell." Each head has two backpointing horns. His three heads were actually inspired by the eight-headed dragon Yamata no Orochi from Japanese mythology. His design was mostly created by Eiji Tsuburaya based on a minimal description in the script: "It has three heads, two tails, and a voice like a bell."

History and Backstory

In every series of Godzilla films, King Ghidorah has a different set of origins. To help organize them, I've divided his backstory into the three series of films starting with the Showa Series in 1964 and ending with the Millennium Series in 2001.

Showa Series (1964-1972)

King Ghidorah was created by the Garogans and was given to the Xiliens, who sent King Ghidorah to Earth to weaken its forces and take it over without any trouble. But the Xiliens did not know of Earth's monsters. King Ghidorah was destined to be given to different alien races, losing his history on the way.

Originally the King of Terror, was said to come from outer space. He was described as an ancient evil that destroyed planets civilizations, including Venus (Mars in the English dub of Ghidorah the Three Headed Monster), and the planets themselves. He arrived on Earth in a magnetic meteorite and laid waste to much of the Japanese countryside. Meanwhile, Godzilla and Rodan had emerged from hibernation to not only attack Japan, but to fight each other as well. Mothra soon came in along with her twin priestesses to con-

vince the two not to fight each other, but to instead fight King Ghidorah. They agreed to help and after a pitched battle, the three headed monster was driven off.

However, he later reappeared on Planet X, a newly discovered planet just behind Jupiter. The inhabitants of the planet, the Xiliens, asked the people of Earth if they could "borrow" Godzilla and Rodan in order to drive the three headed menace away, who they had dubbed Monster Zero. The Earthlings agreed and the two Earth defenders were taken to Planet X to fight Ghidorah. Ghidorah was defeated, but it was later revealed that the Xiliens had control of him the whole time and now they had control of Godzilla and Rodan as well. They then sent the three monsters to rampage on Earth so they could take the planet over for its water supply.

Eventually, the monsters were freed from the mind control thanks to mankind's intervention, and King Ghidorah was attacked by Godzilla and Rodan again. After another pitched fight, King Ghidorah was forced to retreat and he left Earth again. When the



golden dragon next appeared, it was in the film Destroy All Monsters set in 1998 and he was under the control of the Kilaaks, a feminine race of aliens who had many of Earth's monsters enslaved. They demanded that the humans surrender or face total annihilation. The aliens sent the monsters to attack various cities and established a base at Mt. Fuji.

Mankind was eventually able to disrupt the mind control and the ten Earth monsters went to the aliens base. That's when they released their secret weapon, King Ghidorah. He fought against all

ten monsters and while he did put up a fight, he was eventually overwhelmed and killed. Before the events of Destroy All Monsters, King Ghidorah was a pawn of cockroach aliens from the M Nebula Space Colony. He was sent to earth along with Gigan to destroy human civilization starting with Japan. The two monsters caused great destruction in Tokyo before Godzilla and Anguirus arrived to save the day. After a tag team battle, Ghidorah was abandoned by Gigan and forced to fight Godzilla and Anguirus alone. He eventually retreated but not before taking a beating.

Heisei Series (1991)

The three-headed King of Terror was revamped for the 1991 film Godzilla vs. King Ghidorah. In this movie, time traveling people from the 23rd century come to 1991 to tell the people of Japan that Godzilla will cause their country's destruction. They offered to go back in time and remove the Godzillasaurus from Lagos Island during WWII before it was exposed to hydrogen bomb tests shortly afterwards. The Japanese accept and while the 23rd century people did remove the dinosaur, they put in its place three little creatures called Dorats which are hit full force by the H-bomb tests and fuse into a three headed monstrosity called King Ghidorah.

Given that the future people could control the Dorats, they were able to manipulate King Ghidorah and used him to destroy Japan. Just when all hope seemed lost, Ghidorah was confronted by none other than Godzilla. Godzilla had returned thanks to the radiation of a nuclear sub and came ashore to fight the three headed terror but despite this, Godzilla was no match for him. It took mankind's intervention to disable the mind control which left King Ghidorah confused and powerless, allowing Godzilla to blow the middle head off with his atomic breath.

Frightened, the now two-headed dragon tried to escape, but was shot down by another blast of Godzilla's breath and he fell into the sea. While Japan was safe from Ghidorah's wrath, and the future people as well as their ship had teleported in front of Godzilla and he destroyed it, they had another problem on their hands. Being the product of modern nuclear technology this time, Godzilla was bigger, badder and more powerful than ever and once again rampaged through Japan. Needing a way to stop him, the Japanese asked the only future person on their side, Emi, to revive King Ghidorah and bring him back to fight Godzilla. She did, and King Ghidorah was brought back as a cyborg with new enhanced abilities and even a robotic head replacing the missing middle one. Despite his newfound powers and gadgets, Ghidorah was still defeated by Godzilla and both creatures fell into the sea. Ghidorah was dead, but his cyborg parts would later be used to create Mechagodzilla 2.

Millenium Series (2001)

For the 2001 film *Godzilla Mothra and King Ghidorah: Giant Monsters All-Out Attack*, King Ghidorah was given another backstory. This time, he was one of three guardian monsters of the Japanese Islands, similar to the eight-headed dragon Yamata no Orochi. In this story, Ghidorah is said to be underdeveloped. He is supposed to have eight heads but was awoken prematurely, growing only three heads.

Ghidorah was slumbering in a crystal tomb near Mt. Fuji and slowly began to awaken as the prophecy foretold when Godzilla attacked Japan again and killed one of the guardian monsters, Baragon. Ghidorah was the last of the guardian beasts to awaken, coming to assist Mothra, another guardian, in a heated battle against Godzilla. When he tried to inject Godzilla with electric bolts, he was knocked out cold. Godzilla then tried to finish him with his atomic breath, but Mothra took the full force of the blow and was defeated. When she was killed, her essence revived Ghidorah, who rose up in a ball of swirling energy.

Godzilla tried to attack him with another atomic blast but Ghidorah took the full brunt of it, amplified it, and sent it back, which knocked Godzilla into Tokyo Bay and gave him an open wound in his shoulder. The two monsters continued to fight in the bay and when King Ghidorah tried to attack Godzilla with gravity beams, they only served to further energize his nightmarish opponent. Godzilla lashed out with his atomic breath, now many times stronger due to the energy of the gravity beams, and completely wiped out the golden dragon. However, Ghidorah's spirit, along with those of his fellow guardians, entered Godzilla's body and stunned him long enough for an explosive drill to be fired and detonated inside Godzilla. When the King of Monsters tried to use his atomic breath again, it burst

out of his shoulder wound, vaporizing him from within. While the guardians were successful, Godzilla's heart was still beating at the bottom of the bay.

Powers and Abilities

King Ghidorah has had many abilities at his disposal, varying from series to series. However, he does have a few constants. Given that he has wings, King Ghidorah is gifted with the power of flight, at speeds up to Mach 3. The three-headed menace can also use his wings to create devastating hurricane winds with his wings, just like Rodan. The King of Terror can even use his long necks to constrict his opponents, rendering them completely helpless or killing them.

His most famous attacks are the golden Gravity Beams he fires from his mouths. He can even inject them into his opponents by biting them and firing the crackling beams into their skin. In the Showa series, King Ghidorah was also shown to be able to generate what seemed to be magnetic fields. These magnetic abilities were expanded in the Game Boy Advanced game *Godzilla Domination!* In this game, the King of Terror can fire devastating magnetic beams from his mouth and generate a magnetic pull around him that draws monsters close and injures them. He can maintain the presence of this field for roughly ten seconds before having to recharge.

Appearances

As one of the most popular Godzilla monsters, King Ghidorah has appeared in not only six films, but also a whopping twenty two Godzilla video games including: *Godzilla: Monster of Monsters*, *Godzilla Save the Earth*, and *Godzilla Unleashed*. He also appeared in two episodes of Toho's TV show, *Zone Fighter* along with Godzilla and Gigan. He was one of the few monsters to survive an encounter with the Zone Fighter.

Ghidorah has various other appearances outside of Godzilla as well, appearing four times in the cartoon *Courage the Cowardly Dog*, notably two episodes when LeQuack turns on a TV with King Ghidorah on it, and shoots fire from the TV. Another time is when Courage opens a door and King Ghidorah is behind it, giving a loud roar. Both clips were from Ghidorah, the Three-Headed Monster.

It is also interesting to note that after the release of the Rebirth of Mothra trilogy, the term Ghidorah changed meaning. Instead of just an alias for King Ghidorah, it became a species of space monsters. Other Ghidorahs include Desghidorah from *Rebirth of Mothra*, Grand Ghidorah from *Rebirth of Mothra III* and Keizer Ghidorah from *Godzilla Final Wars*.

Final Thoughts

If Godzilla is the King of Monsters, then King Ghidorah is without a doubt the King of Terror. The three-headed dragon is one of Godzilla's most powerful foes, and some think he is even stronger than the monster king. The reason for this is that Godzilla almost always needs the help of other monsters or mankind in order to defeat him. I love King Ghidorah for his sheer power and his terrifying rampages. He made a great addition to *Godzilla Unleashed*, as did his cyborg counterpart Mecha King Ghidorah because of his great moves and abilities, though he can be a little tough to learn at first. All in all, King Ghidorah is an amazing monster truly worthy of being Godzilla's arch rival. *Next Class Topic: Biollante*

Food

Try these tasty Easter appetizers

Another delicious recipe for your Easter get-together or just for a festive treat. This recipe is for Bunny Biscuits and was found on tasteofhome.com. This recipe is for 5 servings. To make this you will need the following:

- * 10 raisins
- * 20 slivered almonds
- * 1 tube of pink colored decorating icing
- * 5 red hot candies
- * 1 tube of buttermilk biscuits

Begin by gently shaping 5 biscuits into oval shapes. Place these on a greased baking sheet around 2



inches from each other. Cut the remaining biscuits in half, these will be shaped into the ears of the bunny. Firmly attach the ears to the whole biscuits by pressing hard. Put two raisin eyes and four almond whiskers on each of the biscuits. Then bake the biscuits at 375 for eight to ten minutes (or until biscuits are browned to perfection). Cool slightly and use the icing to frost ears, place the candies as noses.

You are now left with delicious edible bunnies! Place these next to your Easter pie, and deviled eggs!

Easter Pie

This Easter recipe is brought to you by foodnetwork.com. Cook this delicious Easter Pie to spice up the party with a fantastic treat. For this recipe you will need the following:

- * 3/4 cup powdered sugar, plus extra for garnish
- * 3 large eggs
- * 2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- * 1 tablespoon orange zest
- * 1 (15-ounce) container whole milk ricotta cheese
- * 1/2 cup cooked short-grained rice
- * 1/3 cup toasted pine nuts
- * 6 sheets fresh phyllo sheets or frozen, thawed
- * 3/4 stick (3 ounces) unsalted butter, melted

Start by blending a cup of powdered sugar, vanilla, eggs, ricotta, and orange zest until it is smooth.

You will need a food processor or similar tool for this process. Then stir in the rice and pine nuts. Sit



that mixture aside for a moment. Next preheat the oven to 375 Fahrenheit.

Lightly butter a pie dish around 9 inches. Lay 1 phyllo sheet on the dish and allow it to hang over the dishes' sides. Brush the dish with melted butter. Top with a second layer of phyllo dough, in the opposite direction of the first. Continue to layer and butter.

Spoon the ricotta into the dish, and fold the overhanging dough over the top of the filling to enclose completely. Brush the entire pie with melted butter. Bake pie until golden brown and filling has set. It should take around 35 minutes. Let cool, then sift powdered sugar over pie and serve!
