On Tuesday, the team traveled to New Hartford to take on the Spartans, a team that has been dominant over the Raiders in recent seasons. Unfortunately, the Spartans kept it this way as they defeated the Raiders 10-6.

The big difference in Tuesday's game was how it started. The Raiders came out weak and gave up three goals in the first quarter and they only answered with one. And then *deja vu* happened again as the cored doubled to 6-2 Spartans.

After halftime, the Raiders knew they needed to pick up the pace and did just that as the teams traded three goal tallies for a 9-5 New Hartford lead. With only one quarter left, the Raiders needed to put up four goals to tie against a strong defensive team but the two sides battled to a goal apiece for the 10-6 Spartan final.

RJ Borrow, Seth Delisle, Bryce Knight, Carson Vono, Austin Wilde all scored a goal while Matt Nelson added two assists.



Playoff positions on the line as NHL season ends

The most grueling playoffs in all of sports, the 2014 Stanley Cup Playoffs, will start in 12 days, and the race for the final spots is rapidly coming to an end. In the Eastern Conference Boston, Pittsburgh, Tampa Bay, and Montreal have all clinched playoff berths, with Boston clinching the first seed. St. Louis, Anaheim, San Jose, Colorado, Chicago and Los Angeles have all clinched playoff berths in the west, while Minnesota, Dallas, and Phoenix are fighting for the other two spots in the Western Conference. All of the teams only have 5-7 games remaining out of their 82 game schedules.

In the Eastern Conference Boston has been a dominant team of late, and they have clinched the first seed to make it to the post season seven seasons in a row. Boston has to watch out for the al-

ways strong Pittsburgh Penguins behind Sidney Crosby, who leads the NHL in points with 10 on the season and six games to go. The battle is on for the other four eastern positions, with NY Rangers, Philadelphia, Detroit, and Washington currently holding the inside edge.

St. Louis Anaheim and San Jose are all within four points for the top of the Western Conference. St. Louis looks like the team to beat and they will likely get the first seed. Minnesota will make it to the playoffs as they have a four point lead on Dallas and Phoenix, who are battling for the last spot. It could come down to the last game of the season on April 13th and the winner of that game could make it into the post season.

This day in history: April 4

In 1865 on this day, President Abraham Lincoln spoke with one of his close friends about a strange dream. Abraham told Ward Hill Lamon about his dream the night before hearing the "subdued sobs of mourners" and seeing a corpse in the White House East Room. During the dream the late President inquired about the death to a nearby soldier and the soldier answered, "The president, he was killed by an assassin."

After that Lincoln woke up and was subsequently bothered by the dream ever since. President Abraham Lincoln was shot dead by an assassin in the Ford Theater ten days later.

Dr. Martin Luther King was assassinated on this day in 1968. He was fatally shot shortly after 6 pm, on the motel balcony. Dr. King was staying on the second floor at the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, Tennessee. When he was fired upon, he was going to a diner to support a sanitation workers' strike.

The bullet struck and entered into his jaw and continued through to sever his spinal cord. The 39 year old civil rights leader was pronounced dead at his arrival to the hospital. Days before a protest march King was involved in ended in a violent attack and the death of a young African-American teen. When Dr. King left the area he vowed to come back in early April for another demonstration.

The protests and riots that sparked after the news of King's death spread and grew to the point that National Guard troops were deployed.

Tragedy struck in 1975 when a large scale United States air lift cargo jet crashed not too long after leaving Tan Son Nhut in Saigon. This cargo jet was filled with South Vietnamese orphans as part of Operation Baby Lift. The operation was an attempt to bring 2,000 babies to the US in order to be adopted. The crash left 138 passengers (mostly babies) dead. This operation started on a tragic note, yet the rest of the air lifts were completed safely.

April 4, 1982 was the day that Wayne Gretzky finished his season with 212 points. Gretzky from the Edmonton Oilers finished as the first and only member in the NHL to break the 200 point barrier. Gretzky, now a Hall of Famer, was a hockey freak of nature, going pro at 17 and playing with the Indianapolis Racers with the World Hockey Association. He was then traded to the Oilers in 1979. Gretzky quickly showed that he was the best in the NHL and won the Hart Memorial Trophy for the league's MVP as well as the Art Ross scoring leader trophy multiple times. His nickname was "The Great One."


