## Tough topics greet students at recent health conference

A variety of topics awaited the students from Youth4Youth who attended the Teen Health Conference May 7 and 8. Joining G Ray Bodley's Youth4Youth group representatives Cheyanne Velasquez, Taylor Simpson, Mykenzie Finch and Dawson Samson were students from Oswego and Central Square high schools as well..

The students spent their time at Camp Hollis doing team building activities, sitting in on educational presentations, and even some arts and crafts time. Chris, one of the coordinators from Teen Health, commented that, "it's so cool to get all these teens together that don't necessarily know each other, and to see them build relationships over just a couple days. And they learn about important issues while they do it."

Teen Health organized a few presentations and activities for the students to participate in, the first of which was the showing of the movie *Tough Guise*, a documentary about the effects movies, television, peer influence, economic influence, and emphasis on violence have on the psyche of young men. The film highlighted the desensitization of young men through movies like *Scarface*, the rep-

placed eighth in the nine team field.

Mike Holcomb and Nick Reitz led the Raider boys by earning first team all-league honors for winning their events. Holcomb won the 400 meter dash in a time of 53.00 while Reitz won the shot put with a throw of 43 feet and 11.5 inches. Earning second team all-league were Holcomb, Jimmy Martin, and Connor Aldasch as Holcomb took second in the triple jump with a jump of 39 feet and 4.25 inches while Aldasch placed second in the 400 hurdles as he ran a time of 1:01.39. Martin ran to a second place finish in the 800 meter run with a time of 2:02.84.

Martin and Aldasch also placed third in their other events, as Aldasch took third in the 110 hurdles with a 16.58 and Martin got it in the 1600 meter run by running a 4:37.03. Garet Roik took fourth in pole vault as he vaulted 9 feet 6 inches while the 4x800 team of Jacob Belcher, Kenny Deloff, Ian Devendorf, and Geoff Michaels took fifth place. Danny Phillips took sixth in the 3200 meter run with a time of 10:58.29 as the

Raiders scored a total of 73 points to trail only surprise winner East Syracuse-Minoa, Jamesville-Dewitt, and Mexico.

On the Lady Raiders side Makenzie Loomis and Shannon Zych earned second team all-league awards. In the long jump, Loomis jumped 15 feet and 4 inches while in high jump, Zych jumped 4 feet 6 inches. In the 100 hurdles, Amber Desteve took third with a time of 17.84 and also took third in the 400 meter hurdles as she ran 1:15.03. The Lady Raiders 4x100 meter team ran a 55.81, good enough for a sixth place finish. Also taking sixth was the 4x800 relay team with a time of 11:44.35. The Lady Raiders ended with a total score of 33 points.

The track teams' season closes out soon, as the boys have two more races and the girls have one. The Raiders travel to Cicero-North Syracuse on Saturday for the C-NS Boys Invite. On May 21, the Lady Raiders host the Section 3 Class A Championships, then on May 23 the boys travel to Camden for their sectional final.

resentation of men hiding behind masks with examples like *The Wizard of Oz*, and even talked about the emotional detachment men must show for fear of being labeled anything other than a man.

The next day, Teen Health had a drug presentation prepared by a woman named Nicole whose whole life had been altered by the drug use of those around her. She told the students about the unfortunate downward spiral of her family after her siblings decision to use drugs. Her presentation was emotional, and had an extremely strong impact on most of the students, including a student from Central Square High School who said, "When she started, I thought she was just like every other person who's against drugs, but once she started crying I knew her life seriously was ruined by drugs. And she didn't even do them."

Self-image, and teen pregnancy were the next presentations for the students, they were split up into two different groups and went to each separately. For the self-image presentation, Sarah, from the Oswego SAF group, showed the group a commercial for Dove with a sketch artists asking people to describe themselves, and then asking complete strangers to describe the same person. The end result was very powerful, and it is recommended that everyone sees this commercial. Sarah then asked the group to write their names on a piece of paper, and then pass their papers around the room, and each member of the group was to write something they liked about that person on each paper.

As it may be well known by now, teen pregnancy has reached epidemic proportions among the youth of America, and as such, showing teens what having a child is really like is a priority. A young mother and her three year old daughter came to the camp to talk to the group about her experience with teen pregnancy. She told the group about the end of the relationship she thought would never end, and she told them about her financial discourse. She also discussed the crippling pressure of being a young mother.

Those in attendance were then asked to partner up with other students, and then given a list of tasks they must complete while holding their partner's hand. This was to show how difficult it is to do normal everyday tasks while holding a baby. "Using one hand for everything sucks, I give her credit for being able to do it all on her own," GRB student Taylor Simpson stated.

All the activities weren't heavy, however, and the students were

also allowed a few hours of free time. There was even an instructor brought in to do Zumba with the students.

Although the attendance was low compared to past years, this years Teen Health Conference was very successful, but more students, even those not involved with Youth4Youth, are encouraged to go next year.

## This day in history: May 15

A military landmark, a brutal slaying and a song touting the benefits of racial harmony are just three of the noteworthy events to happen on May 15 through the years.

It was on this day in history in 1941 was when the first jet propelled E28/39 aircraft flew in a test flight over England. This was the first Allied jet flight and had a turbojet engine. The turbojet engine functions with thrusts of hot air. Frank Whittle created this engine and has gone on to be known as the creator of the jet engine.

A week after World War II began, Whittles project had renewed interest and was commissioned by the Air Ministry. This engine propelled the aircraft at 370 mph at 25,000 feet and was faster than any conventional propeller driven machine.

In 1976, a dangerous couple carried out an evil plan. On this day Patricia Columbo and Frank DeLuca were arrested for the brutal slaying of Columbo's parents and brother in Illinois. The pair had this plan in order to gain the family inheritance money. The ironic truth was that the family had written Patricia out of the will years back.

When the two were first acquainted a 20 year old Columbo fell in love with a 36 year old DeLuca, who was a married man at the time. The pair had an unusual relationship which included several abnormal behaviors.

# The long wait is over for DDR4 computer memory

DDR4 memory is starting to make its long awaited appearance into the mainstream market, though it is going to take some time. This is partially due to chipset makers, such as Intel, whose latest chipset still uses DDR3. One of the driving forces of this is Crucial, a subsidiary of Micron, which has begun sampling next-gen DDR4 server memory through its new Technology Enablement Program.

Crucial's DDR4 memory is designed to enable next-gen enterprise environments with data rates that start at 2133 MT/s, which happens to be twice as fast as DDR3 when it was first introduced, and is expected to get even faster as the technology matures, Crucial says. When paired with Intel Xeon processor E5-2600 v3 product family-based systems, Crucial DDR4 memory doubles the memory bandwidth from 8.5GB/s to 17GB/

s while using up to 20 percent less voltage than its DDR3 counterpart.

"Memory is one of the biggest limitations when it comes to enterprise server environments. Many memory-dependent server applications are crucial to the day-to-day operations of a business, but they require higher densities of memory and increased performance," said Michael Moreland, worldwide product marketing manager at Crucial. "Crucial DDR4 memory enables servers to perform faster and run more efficiently than ever before, reducing power and cooling expenses along the way, essential for meeting the ever-increasing workload demands of data centers."

Crucial did not say how much its DDR4 modules will cost, however, though it did point out that it backs its DDR4 RAM with a lifetime warranty. *By Perrin Ogden*


