

## Softball charges to tournament title

The tough climb to the top of the Class A softball mountain became a whole lot tougher for the Lady Raiders this week when the team lost a pair of key performers. The Raiders lost two-thirds of the heart of their batting order when their #5 and #6 hitters in the lineup and two key players on the field were lost for the season under differing circumstances.

Senior Hannah Jones tore her ACL in the first inning of the team's 3-1 senior night victory over Mexico on Monday. Hannah was one of the star players in the outfield and one of the clutch hitters in the lineup.

Not only was Jones one of the main players who helped the team succeed many times, she was also a team leader. Jones was always enthusiastic during games and always picked the team up when they were down and encouraged them to do better.

Another player was suspended for undisclosed reasons, and the Raiders will feel her absence, especially from the plate. To compensate for the losses freshmen Brynn Waloven and Mallory Harter have joined from the junior varsity. Harter gained varsity experience at second base last season while left-handed hitter Waloven will get her

first varsity experience at first base.

Last weekend the girls overcame lousy weather and a late start to put together a storm of their own in winning the Strikeout Cancer Tournament in Oswego. Playing opportunistic softball the Raiders drubbed Hannibal 13-0 in five innings before besting Syracuse West 7-1 in the tournament final. Fulton jumped on top of the Warriors early and never looked back, scoring eight times in the first inning and then adding five more in the second.

The Raiders only connected for four hits in the game, but took advantage of 11 walks, three errors and three hit batsmen to record the lopsided win. Cheyenne Laun had two hits, two RBI and scored twice to lead the way while Mikayla Guernsey drove in two runs and scored twice and Caitlin Chrisman also crossed the plate twice for the winners. Keisha Pierce knocked in three runs to back the combined two hit pitching of Laun and Guernsey with Hannibal's Mackenzie Stevens accounting for both Warrior hits.

A similar formula produced another big win in the championship game as the Raiders built a 4-0 lead en route to victory. Fulton put eight runners on base without a hit and also collected seven hits including two doubles from Maureen McCann and a Courtney Parker two-bagger. Laun scattered six hits and struck out seven for the 10-5 Raiders, who will face Homer on Saturday in a make-up game at 11:30 am before a doubleheader at Cortland on Tuesday to conclude the regular season.

## NHL's final four is nearly set

The second round of the NHL playoffs are almost finished as the defending champion Chicago Blackhawks advanced to the Western Conference finals to face the winner of the Los Angeles Kings and the Anaheim Ducks tonight. The Montreal Canadiens and the New York Rangers have advanced to the conference finals in the Eastern Conference and will start their best of seven series at 1 pm on Saturday.

The Chicago Blackhawks have made an impressive run to try and defend their title, beating St. Louis in the first round and Minnesota in the second while winning both series 4 games to 2. The Kings have shown themselves to be a resilient team in the playoffs. After being down 3-0 in the first round they are facing another seven game series, against the team with the best record in the west, the Ducks after staying alive once again on Wednesday night with a 2-1 win in Los Angeles.

The Rangers shocked the hockey world by winning two straight games late in the series with Pittsburgh, to win in seven games. The Rangers will now face off against the Montreal Canadiens, who beat last year's finalists Boston in seven games. The Rangers have faced two hard fought seven game series against the Flyers and Penguins, but the Canadiens are going to be a tough matchup for them as the Canadiens swept the Lightning then went on to beat Boston, the team with the best regular season record in the NHL, in seven games.

### Into the Wild:

## Bagging a gobbler is no easy task

The 2014 spring turkey season is already half over and with each passing day as the heat rises the hunting becomes more and more challenging. By now many toms have been accompanied by hens, making filling your tags nearly impossible.

There are many strategies to get after the already henned-up toms. One is to switch up the traditional hunting hours. Turkey hunters traditionally are out of the woods by eight or nine o'clock, however the best time to harvest a mature tom turkey is after 9 o'clock, the reason being that, the hen that was with the tom may venture off and in the short period they are separated you can make your move. Using a crow call or an owl call to provoke a gobble in the later morning hunts can be a good location strategy for your tom.

Finding the roost of your tom turkeys and patterning them is also important. The only way to do this is to go after them persistently, not one or two hunts a week. Patterning your birds is important this time of the season, and the best way to hunt birds you have patterned is to set up and stay put. Whether a strutting area used daily, or a common pass through area, the best thing to do is stay put and wait. If you have turkeys in the area, patterned calling becomes less

of a factor. It is okay to go out turkey hunting and not call as much as usual, as long as you know the area where the big boys want to be, and where the hens are traveling.

It is better to under call than over call this time of year, as you may have noticed that right when the birds are getting out of their roost they happen to shut right up. Too much calling after a tom gets out of a roost could make him nervous and detour him from your position. When you have a tom consistently responding in a nearby roost you should shut up and wait because it is likely he is turned to your position and may fly down towards your decoy setup. If decoys are placed in a visible area to the bird from his roost the chances of him coming in are greatly increased.

Do not underestimate the intelligence of the mature toms on your property, they got to be that size for a good reason, make sure your blind is hidden or you are in a good location, of course turkeys are known for their excellent eyesight. There are two weeks left in the season so hunt smart hunt safe and bag some gobblers.


