



Milestone 400th volleyball win a well kept secret

A surprising first victory of the year became even more of a shock to Fulton Varsity Volleyball Coach Caroline Richardson last Wednesday. Thrilled to see her team break into the victory column for the first time this season following a hard fought, five game win over Jamesville-Dewitt, the veteran coach received an additional surprise when she was informed that it was her 400th career victory.

Entirely focused on getting her team on solid ground following an uncharacteristically slow start to the season, Richardson said that her reaction to the news was that she was, "surprised."

"I honestly didn't realize I was that close," she added, with all 400 victories coming during her 27 year tenure at the Red Raider sideline.

During that time Fulton has never posted a losing season, with a 23-2 Section 3 title and regional championship season in 1996-97 standing as her winningest season so far. The Raiders have been a perennial contender under Richardson as they posted a 92-16 record from 1994-1999 and were 83-18 from 2005-2010 when they finished second in Section 3 three straight times before claiming back to back titles in 2009 and 2010.

But while she noted that, "winning sectional titles are always satisfying," her greatest satisfaction as a coach has come from "developing players and seeing them continue to play volleyball after high school in either college or recreationally." A recreational player herself, the coach is still a force to reckon with on the court where she has been a member of a national championship women's team.

As for the continued success at the varsity level, she was quick to credit both her players and their coaches through the youth ranks. "Hardworking athletes that have the desire to win," she listed as a key to her success, along with, "good coaches that work with players before they come up to varsity level."



Coach Richardson has been a fixture on the Raider sideline for the past 27 seasons, racking up 400 career victories along the way.

Thinking about iOS8? Take these precautions

If you're carrying an iPhone 4 or newer in your pocket, chances are you have received the notification from Apple that your device is now capable of upgrading to the the new iOS 8 operating system. Of course many people like to keep up to date with technology, so those with an iPhone, iPod, or iPad are more than willing to keep their devices up to tabs with the latest software.

Accepting "Terms of Agreement" and clicking the "Install" button without thinking twice just to get the update started has caused hundreds of Apple users to lose much of their saved personal information such as text messages, pictures, and contacts. It is very important to read the steps of installation before bashing on the new operating system for "deleting all my stuff."

Here are some helpful tips to keep in mind before updating your Apple device and watching your all of your data pull a Houdini:

- 1.) Be sure your device has enough storage to download the update. iOS 8 will not download if it notices there is insufficient space for the software. This can be solved by deleting text conversations, apps, photos, and videos.
- 2.) A good connection to the internet is key. Updates should be done on a trusted Wi-Fi source such as home to ensure faster download speeds and data safety. For students, the school's Wi-Fi is also not a good choice due to its speed and unknown stability of security.
- 3.) The fastest way to update is by downloading the software on iTunes manually and installing it on your device. It is also a good

way to ensure the back up and safety of your data.

4.) Back up your data! Follow the following instructions to make your iDevice update hassle free!

Recommended method: To update using iTunes 11 and later, plug your iOS device into your computer and open iTunes. Your device should be listed in the top right corner of the page. Click on your device. On

ting the update button, waiting for the download, and installing.

To update "over-the-air" it is very simple. But be sure to have your iPhone's data backed up and that you are on a Wi-Fi connection. To backup your data on iCloud it is very simple. Click: Settings > iCloud > Storage and Backup > Back up now (Must be on a Wi-Fi connection). You must have iCloud Backup enabled on the same page to

the bottom of that page there will be an option to "Backup Now." Click that button and wait until your device's backup is complete. From this step you are now safe to update your phone. The update option is just above the backup section. It's all as simple as hit-
