

Raider golfers place fourth

A state qualifier and three all-stars highlighted the recently finished golf season for the Fulton Red Raider linksmen. The Raiders combined to shoot a 451 on October 8 at Sunset Ridge, good for fourth place among OHSL small schools and ninth overall out of 20 teams which included schools from the AA bracket.

Nick McIntyre led the way with an 85 to advance to next May's New York State qualifier and was also an honorable mention all-league selection. Mathew Kitts followed with an 88 for Coach Ascenzi's quad and was a first team all-league performer while Cameron Clark shot an 89 and joined McIntyre as honorable mention OHSL standouts.

Oswego ran away with the small school bracket with a team total of 413, a full 17 strokes better than second place East Syracuse-Minoa Blue. Christian Brothers Academy followed in third place with a 444 total with the Raiders fourth, seven strokes better than Jamesville-Dewitt's combined total of 458.
