Bowlers, hoopsters bounce back with big wins

After watching their 30 match unbeaten run come to an end last Thursday against ES-M, the Fulton girls bowling team didn't waste time feeling sorry for itself. Instead the Raiders got right back to business, and that meant trouble for Homer and Chittenango. Running their record to 10-1 on the season, the girls blanked Homer 3-0 on Tuesday and followed it up with a similar 3-0 win over Chittenango on Wednesday.

Senior Kendra Tryniski led the way on both occasions, rolling a high game of 236 and a 690 series against Homer before returning with an even stronger performance against Chittenango that featured a high game of 278 and an impressive 708 series. Kate Ely followed suit with a 225 game and 609 series on Tuesday and an even better 270 game and 696 series on Wednesday.

Zoe June's 200 game and 547 series gave the Raiders the top three scores against Homer and she counted a high game of 192 and a 538 series in the win over Chittenango.

The girls will look to make it three wins in as many days this afternoon when they face CBA at Strike n' Spare Lanes in Mattydale at 3:30 pm.

Boys claim twin victories

The Raider boys kept pace by topping Homer 2-1 to avenge their only loss of the season and then blanking Chittenango 3-0 behind a solid team effort. Kyle Denson and Bryce Guernsey helped Fulton overcome a Homer side that produced three 600 series as Denson rolled for 645 over three games and Guernsey knocked down 622 pins along the way. Bayley Raponi stepped up against

Chittenango with a 671 series while Shawn Walberger added a 629 series and 243 high game. Kyle Denson's 255 was the high game for the 9-1 Raiders as he finished with a 624 series.

Hoopsters cruise past Fowler

In other sports action on Wednesday night the Raider boys basketball team snapped its three game slide in a big way with a convincing 72-46 win over visiting Fowler. Fulton erupted in the opening half by scoring 49 points as the Raiders built a 27-19 first quarter advantage that ballooned to 49-26 at the intermission.

Girls rout Fowler, face Cortland next

A trip to struggling Fowler was just what the doctor ordered for the Red Raider girls basketball team on Tuesday night as Fulton rolled to a 53-26 victory over the Falcons. Earning their second win in six starts, the Raiders improved to 3-6 overall while posting their first league victory at the expense of the 0-10 Falcons.

Nicole Hansen poured in 16 points and Emilee Hyde added a varsity career high 10 for the winners, who reversed a recent trend of falling behind early by charging to a 17-6 first quarter lead. Mallory Clark and Courtney Smith added six points apiece to a Red Raider cause that limited Fowler to 13 points in each half while staking a 33-13 halftime advantage. Jaycia Brunson led the Falcons with five points.

It will be a much tougher task on Friday when the girls travel to Cortland to face the

and Cody Green added 13 for a Raider side that picked up scoring from 11 different players. Tyler Lee had seven points to go with six point nights from Justin Hood, Tyler Shaw and Jacob McDermott in the lopsided victory. Omar Short and Wil Northcut answered with 13 and 12 points respectively for Fowler. The boys will host Cortland on Friday, looking to improve on their 7-3 overall, 2-2 league mark.

Wrestling matches cancelled

The Raider wrestlers meet against CBA/J-D on Wednesday as well as tonight's scheduled showdown with Fairport have both been postponed due to sickness.

Purple Tigers, who bring a 7-4 overall, 3-0 league record into the first of eight straight home games. Cortland has won four in a row and six of the last seven with their lone loss coming in a 52-49 battle at Christian Brothers Academy.

The Tigers are paced by the outside shooting of Shea Swartwout and Jackie Phillips as the pair have drilled in 17 and 11 points per game respectively. They pose a serious outside threat as Phillips has connected 20 times from beyond the three point arc while Swartwout has 19 three-pointers to her credit, more than the combined season total for the Raiders.

Fulton will be looking for another big effort from Hansen, a nine point per game scorer, as well as Michaela Whiteman, who has averaged seven per outing for Coach Lyons crew.

A bobcat that survived getting hit and stuck inside an oncoming car is going back into the Arizona wild.

A couple driving in Scottsdale hit the animal after it darted into their path. Upon reaching their destination, the man inspected his Mazda sedan and saw the very much alive bobcat trapped in the plastic grille. After being rescued a week ago, Arizona's Game and Fish Department officials say the bobcat will be released Friday into Tonto National Forest.

The bobcat has spent the past week at the Southwest Wildlife Rehabilitation Center in Scottsdale, where it was evaluated by a veterinarian. Game and Fish employees sedated the 7-pound animal and removed it. Game and Fish officials called the bobcat's survival without any major injuries a New Year's miracle.
