Raiders post thrilling victory, face CBA next

It will be a case of out of the frying pan and into the fire for the Fulton boys basketball team following their thrilling overtime win against Homer on Tuesday night. Twice clutching victory from the hands of defeat, the Raiders ran their mark to 8-4 overall and 3-3 in league play with a 63-62 win over the Trojans.

Cody Green's three point connection with just two seconds to go in regulation time sent the game into an extra session where Josh Hudson's first long-range basket of the game beat the buzzer to turn a 62-60 deficit into an electrifying win. Green hit five times from beyond the arc to lead all scorers with 21 points and Hudson added seven to go with a 14 point night from Chris Jones.

Homer answered with double-digit performances of 14, 12 and 10 from Jerrad Reiner, Jacob Rivers and Jayden Gavidia in their first league loss in four starts.

It was a start to finish battle between the two evenly matched sides as Homer led 17-15 after the first quarter and 35-54 at the half. A tightly played third quarter saw Fulton outscore the Trojans 9-7 to gain a 43-42 advantage that set the stage for the heart-stopping finish.

The Raiders will have little time to savor the victory, however, as they travel to Syracuse meet traditional powerhouse CBA on Friday with JV action starting at 5:30 pm.

The same holds true for the Fulton girls, as they host the Lady Brothers tonight at 5:30 on the heels of a big 50-39 win at

Homer on Tuesday. Mallory Clark gunned in a season high 21 points to lead the Raider charge to 4-7 overall and 2-4 in league play while Nicole Hansen added 11 and Emilee Hyde continued her recent stand of strong play with seven. The girls used a strong defensive showing to grab a 10-3 first quarter lead and held a 19-11 halftime advantage before both teams caught fire offensively in the second half. Caley Cornwell led the 5-8/1-5 Trojans with 12 points, all from beyond the three-point stripe.

A good start fell by the wayside for the Raider icemen on Tuesday as C-NS scored the final five goals of the game en route to a 6-2 victory. Fulton led 2-1 after one period

but could manage no further scoring as their record dipped to 4-9 overall and 2-7 in league play. The team returns to Cicero Rinks on Friday to face Fayetteville-Manlius in a 5:40 pm start.

The Fulton swim team fell just short on Tuesday in a 99-87 loss at Mexico. Dave Tallents won the 100 freestyle and finished second in the 50 free and Tim McAfee claimed first place points in the 100 breaststroke. Andrew Distin finished second in both the 200IM and 100 free while Justin Grower was the runner-up in both the 100 butterfly and 100 backstroke. Tallents, Grower and McAfee joined Distin to claim first place in the 200 medley relay.



Heavyweight surge carries Phoenix past Fulton

The highly anticipated showdown between Oswego County rivals proved to be a major letdown for the Fulton Red Raiders when all was said and done on Wednesday as Phoenix ran away with a 41-24 victory. What began as a back and forth battle with six lead changes through the first eight weight classes quickly turned into a Phoenix run to victory as the visitors claimed nine of the 15 matches on the night. A strong surge in the upper weights carried the Firebirds to victory as they won four straight bouts and scored 18 unanswered points to gain a lead Fulton could only challenge.

The night started well for the Raiders as Mitch Woodworth scored an 8-5 decision to run his record to 25-0 while Tim Holden and Jacob Bailey earned decisions at 138 and 152 as the two sides traded victories. Travis Race counted a 15 second pin in the 170 pound ring to give the Raiders a 15-14 advantage, but by the time they scored again it was 32-15 Phoenix.

Austin Wirth's 3-2 win at 182 put Phoenix back on top to stay and Tim Gandino followed with a hard-fought 6-4 decision at 195 before Firebird heavyweight standouts William Hilliard and Derrick Button added back to back pins. The Raider responded with a rally

in the next two weights with a decision from Joe Abelgore at 99 and a Wyatt Willis pin in the 106 pound ring to make it 32-24, but Toby McKeen's 6-2 decision at 113 ended all hopes of a Fulton comeback as the Firebirds improved to 13-5 at the expense of the 15-5 Raiders.

Bizarre news of the day:

'Gun that won the West' found

When someone goes for a walk in the park, they usually don't expect the unexpected. But could you fathom walking and finding one of the most historical objects of the Midwest? In November, Great Basin National Park archaeologists discovered a Winchester Model 1873 Rifle. The famous 'gun that won the West' was found in Great Basin National Park, Baker Nev. The weapon has been estimated to be around 132-years-old and despite being exposed to the sun, wind, snow and rain, it was found leaning against a tree in the park.

The metal of the rifle was rusted and the wood of the gun was split, and eroded. After checking the surprisingly still intact serial number on the side, park workers were able to trace the gun back to Cody Firearms Museum in Cody, Wyo. And it has a manufacturing date of 1882. The Winchester Model 1873 was a common rifle for the everyday kind of person and could have been sold from \$25-\$50.

While the parks staff is looking for answers about who left the gun and why it was never retrieved, one thing is certain and that is that this rifle is not an everyday find to the common man anymore.
