And in a connection that travelled from Haiti to Colorado and then Pennsylvania, Advisor Mr. Senecal submitted the last of the pages for this year's edition during spring break.

The final picture in this year's Fultonian included the six students from the HOPE Club and four teachers who visited Haiti over the recent vacation. They e-mailed a picture to Mr. Senecal in Colorado, and he finalized the last page of the 2015 Fultonian and submitted it to the Herff-Jones plant in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.

"It's always a relief to get the final page submitted," Mr. Senecal noted. "Especially

"I especially want to thank all the parents who sent me pictures this year," he added. "We couldn't have done it without your help."
