

The race is on for 2016 Presidential bids

With the presidential primaries underway, eight major politicians have announced their intention to run for president in the upcoming 2016 election. On the Democratic side, there are currently two candidates; former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and United States Senator Bernie Sanders. Half a dozen candidates have thrown their hat into the ring looking to earn the nomination of the Republican Party; Neurosurgeon Ben Carson, U.S. Senator Ted Cruz, Businesswoman Carly Fiorina, Former Governor Mike Huckabee, U.S. Senator Rand Paul, and U.S. Senator Marco Rubio.

Former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton her first taste of national political justice when her husband, former President Bill Clinton, was elected into office and she became the first lady in January 1993. later she was sworn into the U.S. Senate in 2000, She became the first First Lady of the United

States to become a candidate for elected office. Then in 2008 she announced her presidential campaign in an attempt to become the first woman president. After a close primary for the Democratic Party, she lost to current President Barack Obama. She later accepted the chance to become U.S. Secre-

tary of State, and is now hoping to win presidential election.

Senator Bernie Sanders of Vermont started his national political career off by winning a U.S. House of Representatives seat in 1990, becoming the first independent elected to the house in 40 years. Later, in 2005, Sanders ran for a position in the U.S. Senate. then after winning his position, he later was elected in 2012 with 71% of the vote.

As for the Republican Party, Neurosurgeon Ben Carson was a professor of neurosurgery, oncology, plastic surgery, and pediatrics, and the first surgeon to successfully separate conjoined twins joined at the head. In 2008 he was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by former President George W. Bush.

Ted Cruz was elected in 2012 to become a U.S. Senator from Texas. He is the first Hispanic or Cuban American to be elected in the US Senate and was also Solicitor Gen-

eral of Texas from January 9, 2003 to May 12, 2008.

Businesswoman Carly Fiorina was the chief executive officer of Hewlett-Packard (HP) from 1999 to 2005, making her the first woman to lead one of the top twenty U.S. companies. She started by rising through the ranks to become an executive at AT&T.

Next is famed former Governor Mike Huckabee, who was the 44th Governor of Arkansas. He is best known for being a candidate in the 2008 United States Republican presidential primaries and for his daily radio program, The Mike Huckabee Show.

U.S. Senator Rand Paul is an American physician and politician from Kentucky, and son to former U.S. Representative Ron Paul. Paul is a conservative libertarian who is a supporter of the Tea Party movement, but he is also in favor of criminal justice reform, and has criticized aspects of the war on drugs. Paul was sworn in on January 5, 2011, along with his father, who simultaneously served in the House of Representatives from 2011-2013. From 2013-2015, Paul has been the 113th seat in Congress and was added to the Foreign Relations committee and retained his spot on the Health, Education, Labor and Pensions, Homeland Security and Government Affairs, and Small Business committees

United States Senator from Florida Marco Rubio has serving since January 2011. November 2000, Rubio won election to the Florida

House of Representatives. on November 2, 2010, Marco Rubio won the general election with 49 percent of the vote.

There may well be more candidates entering the race as this year progresses, but it already looks like it will be a hotly contested race on both sides of the political fence.
