On Saturday, September 19th the girls varsity volleyball team laced up their running shoes and headed to Minoa to participate in the Ovarian Cancer 5k. The girls decided to participate in the run to help raise money to benefit women who live with this awful disease.

The disease is one that is close to their hearts because G. Ray Bodley High School's own varsity volleyball coach is currently living with it. The girls know first hand what it is like to see someone they care so much about live with something so awful.

Ovarian cancer is one of the easier cancers to beat, but it usually is not diagnosed until the later stages because it shows no harsh symptoms until the later stages. The run that the girls participated in raised \$59,000, and the money will go toward research to find a cure.

On October 13th the girls volleyball team will be having a "Spike Teal" game to help raise money for their beloved coach and other women affected by the disease.
