## Wrestlers take top honors at Andersen Tourney

Overall team depth proved to be the difference maker for the Fulton wrestling team on Saturday when the Raiders charged to the top of a 19 team field at the Andersen Memorial Tournament. With a dozen wrestlers placing fifth or better, the Raiders led the way with 224.5 points to easily outdistance runner-up Lockport (190) and third place finishers Liverpool (158) with Spencerport (137) and New Hartford (121) rounding out the top five places.

Collin Flynn, Tim Holden and Travis Race all contributed first place points to the victorious total by claiming the 145, 152 and

170 pound weight classes respectively. Noah Gates and Jared Crucitti placed second in the 220 and 285 pound rings while Dylan Gorman and James Clark won their consolation round bouts to finish third at 220 and 285 and Kaleb Carreon placed fourth at 106. Four different Raiders ended their night with a win for fifth place status as Thomas Hughes and Cole French recorded pins at 99 and 106 while Wyatt Willis scored a 3-0 decision at 120 and Roy French prevailed 6-2 at 126 pounds.

Flynn's road to the title started with a 10-1 decision in the opening round and a 6-2 decision in the semi-finals before he battled past Baldwinsville's David Rush 3-2 in the 145 pound final. Tim Holden followed with the crown at 152 with a 5-2 decision over Lockport's Steven Kapuscinski and also scored a dominating 16-1 technical fall victory on the afternoon. Travis Race made quick work of the competition at 170 as he registered pins at 2:56 and 3:48 before scoring a victory by injury default against Lake George's Jason Hoffman at the 5:31 mark of the match.

Dylan Gorman and James Clark took opposite approaches to their consolation round triumphs as Gorman scored a technical fall at 182 and Clark fought to a 3-1 decision at 220. Noah Gates was a hard luck second

place finisher at 220 as he dropped a tight 2-1 decision against Amsterdam's Chris Garrison.

The Raiders will be back in action on Wednesday when they host Central Valley with JV action beginning at 6 pm.

### Icemen drop two at B'ville

A tough stretch of three games in three days came to an end for the Raider hockey team on Saturday when they finished on the wrong end of a 7-3 loss to tournament host Baldwinsville. One day after watching Cazenovia connect four times in the third period of a 5-2 Laker triumph, the Raiders were overwhelmed by the defending champion Bees. Garrett Gray scored three times and added two assists for the host side and Isaiah Pompo had a goal and two assists. Josh Dynka answered with a goal and an assist for Fulton, as the Raiders fell to 1-3 on the season.

On Friday night Fulton picked up two goals from Austin Vashaw to build a 2-1 lead through the opening two periods. But it all came undone in the final stanza when Caz struck for four goals, paced by Graham Demo's goal and three assists. Evan Beckwith, Nolan Bonnie and Josh Dynka all had helpers for the Raiders, who look to regroup before their next game on Tuesday when they will host Liverpool in a 6 pm start.
