## Korea's bomb claims disputed

After a magnitude 5.1 earthquake was felt last Wednesday morning at 10 a.m. local time, North Korea claimed to have successfully tested a hydrogen bomb. If true, this would be a total game changer. The United Nations Security Council, including China, Russia, and the United States, condemned the test as being a "clear violation of (past) resolutions...and of the nonproliferation game."

Not only are hydrogen bombs much more difficult to make, they produce a much more powerful blast than atomic bombs like the ones dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki in World War II. If North Korea's claims are true, it would be a huge advancement in their still-limited nuclear arsenal.

Experts are not convinced, however.

Weapon analysts state that the yield and seismic wave of Wednesday's testing is similar to that of North Korea's earlier, less powerful atomic bomb testings. According to White House spokesman Josh Earnest, "The initial analysis is not consistent with North Korean claims."

That analysis is not definite, though, and tests are still being conducted to determine what type of bomb North Korea tested.

To punish North Korea, South Korea will resume propaganda broadcasts, blasting Korean pop music, reports comparing the economic conditions and freedom of both countries, and commercials for consumer goods from amplifiers reaching far into North Korean territory.

As a show of support, the United States on Sunday flew a nuclear-capable B-52 bomber over South Korea.

U.S. officials are currently discussing what further steps should be taken to assist South Korea. According to the South Korean media, the U.S. may send F-22 fighter jets, nuclear-powered submarines, B-2 bombers, and other "strategic assets" to South Korea.

For now, the 28,500 U.S. troops currently located in South Korea are urged to be vigilant, according to commander General Curtis Scaparrotti.
