Fast starts produce big Wednesday wins

It loomed as a final tune-up for this weekend's Section III Duals, but instead the Raiders barely had to break a sweat on Wednesday night while demolishing Oswego and East Syracuse-Minoa in lopsided wrestling finals. The Raiders played pin-o-rama and took all but two bouts on the night while posting wins of 84-6 over the Buccaneers and 74-3 against the Spartans. When all was said and done Fulton left town with a 13-5 overall record and its sights set on this Saturday's opening round match against rival Phoenix at the annual gathering of Section III powers.

Forfeits helped pad the final tally on each count as the Raiders picked up seven forfeits against Oswego and six from ES-M. Aaron Yablonski opened the scoring in both

matches as he and Samuel Jones sandwiched pins around Zach Caruso's six pointer for Oswego and the rout was on. Fulton closed the match with pinning efforts from Joe Coccozza, Victor Runeare and John Parrish.

Against ES-M the Raiders rolled to a 68-0 lead as Yablonski scored his second pin of the night to go with six point slams from Kaleb Carreon, Wyatt Willis, Adam DeMauro and Dylan DeMauro. Fulton meets Phoenix at 10 am in a match to be staged at Cicero-North Syracuse.

Icemen keep rolling

Fulton struck quickly and never let up on Wednesday to skate past Rome Free Academy 6-3. Cameron Clarke scored three times to pace the Raiders to their fifth straight victory as the home side jumped on top 3-0 after one period and took a 5-1 lead into the second intermission. Ryan Ross added a goal and two assists while Josh Dynka and Kameron Whipple also found the back of the Black Knight goal. Nolan Bonnie had a big night with three assists to go with two assist showings from Ben Perl

and Dylan Sheldon.

The victory marked Fulton's longest winning streak since the 2007 team won four straight games to lift the Raiders to 4-4 in league play and 6-7 overall. The icemen face a major test this Saturday when they travel to Mohawk Valley in a must-win game that is scheduled for 4:30 pm at Whitestown Arena.

Girls bombard ES-M

Fulton ran to a 16-5 first quarter lead and never looked back en route to a 63-37 girls basketball victory at East Syracuse-Minoa on Wednesday. The Raiders led 35-18 at the half and 54-29 after three quarters to improve to 7-5 overall 2-3 in league play at the expense of the 1-13 Spartans.

A balanced attack that saw eight different players score at least four points helped Fulton end a three game slide in decisive fashion. Emilee Hyde and Sydney Gilmore netted nine points apiece to go with eight point nights from Brittany Alton, Nicole Hansen and McKenna Chesbro. The girls are back in action tonight when they travel to Homer for a 7 pm match-up.

Swimmers fall to undefeated J-D/CBA

Fulton's swimming and diving team had a hard but good meet against J-D/CBA last night, ending with a score of 101-80. While not particularly close at the end, the meet went much better than it could have, and our athletes performed well.

If not for the postponement of the Pulaski-

Sandy Creek meet, this would have been the Raiders last dual meet of the season. The goal here, if a win was not within reach, was to swim and dive well, achieving as many personal improvements as possible. Much of the team, in scoring and in exhibition

University shooting leaves 20 dead in Pakistan

On Wednesday afternoon, four militants in northwest Pakistan attacked Bacha Khan University during a ceremony leaving at least 20 dead. The four gunman were shot down by security forces after an exchange of fire. While the number of casualties has not been confirmed, it is expected to increase.

Though no group has claimed responsibility for the attack, in 2014 a Pakistani Taliban attack left 145 people dead during a school shoot-

ing. The school shooting in 2014 was only 25 miles from Wednesday's attack.

The Prime Minister of Pakistan, Nawaz Sharif, was attending a World Economic Forum when the attack took place. In a recent office statement, the Prime Minister expressed his grief for the victims of the attack, and also spoke about his plan to eradicate terrorism out of Pakistan.


