Wrestling duo seek state tournament glory

A pair of Fulton juniors will seek an end to a 20 year drought this weekend when Jared Crucitti and Travis Race take part in the New York State Wrestling Championships in Albany.

For Crucitti it will be a trip into untested waters while Race will make his third consecutive appearance at wrestling's big dance, with each looking to put his name among the Red Raider immortals as a New York State Champion. Only five other wrestlers have earned that distinction, the last coming in 1996 when Matt Kitts claimed the 167 pound title at the Syracuse War Memorial.

Crucitti enters the fray on the back of a 36-7 season that has seen him score nine

straight wins en route to both the Class A and Section III title at 285 pounds. He comes in battle tested after a dramatic 2-1 overtime victory against Indian River's Dylan Ashwood and has scored 19 pins this season while raising his career mark to 70-29 with 37 pins.

Crucitti will take on Section 9 Middletown's Joe Humphrey, with the winner facing either Mike Larm of Brewster or Jordan Wasmund-Ringer of Lake Shore.

Race knows the rigors of the NYSPHSAA championships well, having taken part as both a freshman and a sophomore. Coming off an injury interrupted season that saw him miss three weeks of action in January, he

brings a lifetime mark of 127-33 with 91 pins including a 23-4 record this year that included an impressive 18 six point slams.

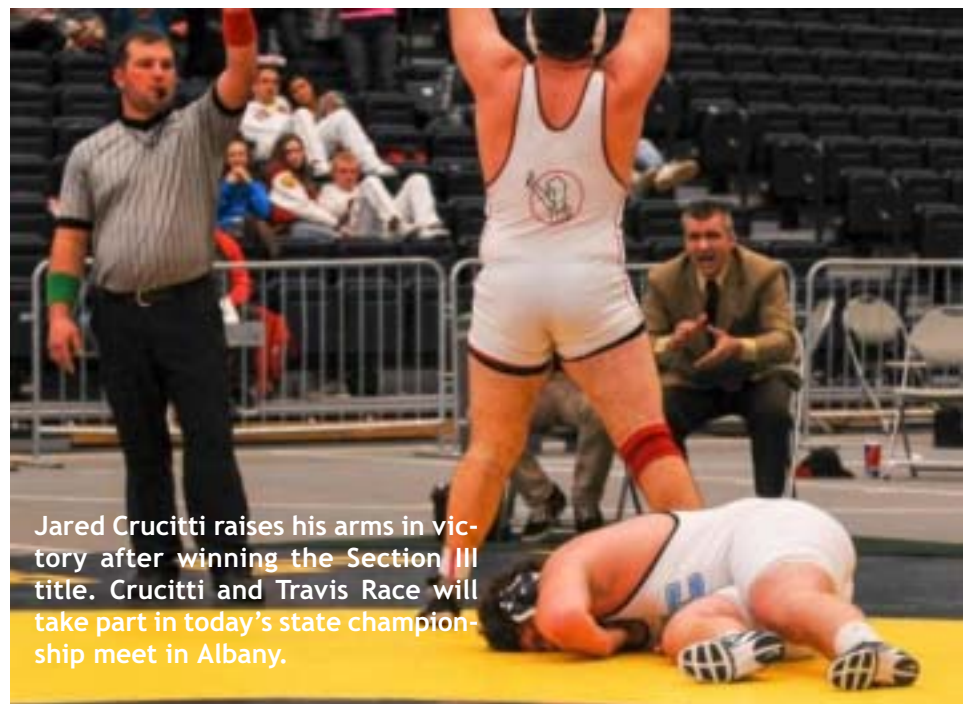
The junior standout finished second to Indian River dynamo Sonny McPherson at both the Class A and Section III finals, but made his way to Albany by virtue of a wild card selection. In each of the past two years he has won the opening match only to fall in the next two, so making it to the podium will be the ultimate goal this time around.

The journey begins with a bout against Jeremy Hughes of McArthur with the winner advancing against either Collin Derbogossiam of Schenectady or Niagara Wheatfield's Colin Goodrich.

New releases offer a wide range of choices

If you're looking to escape from the ever-changing weather conditions, there are lots of new movies at the box office this weekend, including *Hail, Caesar!*, *Zoolander 2*, *Deadpool*, *Race*, *Risen*, and *Gods of Egypt*.

Hail, Caesar! stars Josh Brolin as Eddie Mannix and follows his

attempt to collect the ransom money to free Hollywood superstar actor Baird Whitlock (played by George Clooney), who is being held hostage by a mysterious group, without being caught by the media. Tilda Swinton, Scarlett Johansson, Jonah Hill, and Channing Tatum co-star.

Zoolander 2 stars Ben Stiller and Owen Wilson as Derek Zoolander and Hansel, respec-

tively. The movies follows their mission to unravel a conspiracy to assassinate a large number of celebrities who endorse Zoolander. Will Ferrell, Olivia Munn, Kristen Wiig and Penelope Cruz are also in this movie.

Marvel's anti-hero with the red and black jumpsuit finally gets a movie of his own in *Deadpool*. After Wade Wilson (played by Ryan Reynolds) agrees to undergo treatment for his terminal cancer, he ends up with a badly disfigured face and mysterious healing powers and becomes determined to find out who was behind this and take his revenge. This is Marvel Studios' first movie to receive an R rating in the U.S. Just a warning.

Race stars Stephan James as Jesse Owens, who was a black Olympic sprinter who entered the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin to challenge Adolf Hitler's Nazi ideology. Hitler intended for the Games to test his theory that the Germans were superior as a race, and Owens tried-and succeeded-in disproving that theory.

With Easter right around the corner, *Risen* is especially for the religious people out there. It retells the story of the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth from the perspective of two people who have been given the ill-fated assignment of disproving that story. The movie has already received a positive reaction from the critics.

Gods of Egypt stars Brenton Thwaites as Bek, who enlists the help of the god Horus to save the world and his true love from the god Set and his forces of darkness. This is for those looking for an intense action movie who don't want to see something as naughty as *Deadpool*.

Raiders excelled on the courts this season

While it is sad to say that the final hours have come and gone for the girls and boys basketball teams, it was a season filled with plenty of excitement for both Raider sides.

Both teams ended their seasons in the second round of the playoffs with identical 14-8 records, the best record each team has posted in a very long time. This is the second year in a row that the boys team made it into the sectional tournament, and for the girls, the fourth year in a row they have been to the post-season and third time making it to the second round.

The boys team played exceptionally well in the first round against Oneida winning 81-56 on their home court, but in the second round the Raiders fell to Watertown 84-61. The game was neck and neck until the fourth quarter when the boys were outscored 33-17. Looking back on the season, the boys accomplished exactly what they wanted to and more. Each game every player gave their all and it definitely showed.

Among the team's accomplishments was an eight game winning streak, the longest in more than 20 years, and the team's first

win over Jamesville-Dewitt in 11 seasons to break a 14 game drought against the perennially tough Red Rams.

The girls won their first sectional game 66-62 against Utica Notre Dame on the home court, just the second home sectional game that the girls have hosted in four years. The Lady Raiders season ended against Christian Brothers Academy with a score of 45-33. With the season over, the girls team can look back at all of the things they accomplished, not just the end result. This year's team went on a six-game win streak, their best run in over ten years, and the 14 victories is the most by a Fulton varsity side in recent memory. The girls were nearly unstoppable at home while winning 10 of 11 starts, making this year's team the new team to beat for future Lady Raider basketball squads.

A whole season cannot be judged by a final game. Both teams rose above the expectations of coaches and fans this year. It will be hard to fill some of the seniors spots on both teams, but the underclassmen are hungry for next season. The girls will be losing four players including one starter. Emilee Hyde, Kate Myers, Hunter Hartnraft and Shelby Buffham will be the seniors leaving the girls program. The boys say good bye to eight seniors including all five starters. Ethan Dexter, Tyler Lee, Tyler Shaw, Robbie Pollack, Josh Hudson, Justin Hood, Jake McDermott and the newest addition to the 1000 point club, Cody Green.

The seniors from both programs have put in countless hours toward the game and will be greatly missed. Two great seasons for both teams are definitely something to be proud of.

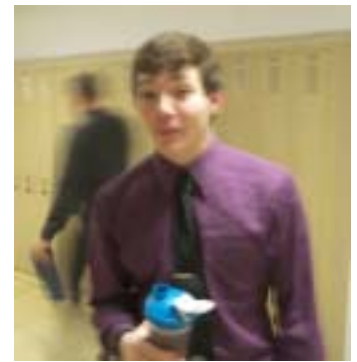
