

Icemen take massive win vs. #4 Syracuse

It's great when a plan comes together, and on Wednesday night that is exactly what happened for the Fulton hockey team. Excellent goaltending and timely offense combined with a penalty free approach to hockey proved to be the difference in a huge 4-2 win over #4 state-ranked Syracuse.

Running their unbeaten string to nine games (8-0-1) the Raiders helped solidify their chances for a playoff position by improving to 9-7-1 overall and 6-4-1 in league play while handing SYracuse just its second loss in 19 games.

"I was confident going in to be honest with you," first year Coach Jason Heindorf said of a team that has completely reversed its fortunes following a seven game losing streak. "It's a huge win for the whole program."

Austin Vashaw scored two goals, including an empty net marker to cap a three goal third period after the Raiders had fought to

a 1-0 lead with a goal in the second period.

Ryan Ross contributed a goal and an assist while Rocco Cannatta also found the back of the Syracuse net.

Spencer Evans turned back 32 shots for the

Raiders, who will have little time to rest as they host #14 state-ranked Baldwinsville on Friday at 6 pm before finishing the regular season on Tuesday at home against #2 ranked West Genesee.

Be classic with these great LPs

In October, *RaiderNet Daily* published an article on albums from the 70s that any classic rock fan should listen to. In response to the article, we bring you a follow up with five more classic rock albums for you to experience.

CCR (Creedence Clearwater Revival), a band that is known for their southern style and folk rock music, released *Cosmo's Factory* in July of 1970. CCR is a medley of John Fogerty singing lead vocals and picking lead guitar, Tom Fogerty on rhythm guitar, Stu Cook on bass and Doug Clifford on drums. The album lasts just under forty three minutes and includes such classics as I Heard It Through The Grapevine and Up Around The Bend.

From their premier album onward, Led Zeppelin became a band that changed rock immensely. Their self titled first album, *Led Zeppelin*, was released in January of 1969 and lasts just under forty five minutes. The band is made up of Robert Plant on vocals, Jimmy page on guitar, John Paul Jones on bass, and John Bonham on the drums. This album has such Led Zeppelin hits as Good Times Bad Times and Communication Breakdown.

Loss of sight can't stop artist Steven Erra

Many people do not realize the luxury of sight, especially art students, who depend on their eyes to do their work. From sculpting to painting to photography, artists all over the world rely on their eyes to decide whether or not their work is sufficient. Sure, someone can click a button on a camera if they are blind. But they cannot tell you exactly what their picture is going to come out like everytime.

Visually-impaired, Steven Erra has become a member of The Seeing With Photography Collective, and makes beautiful pieces of art. He specializes in what is known as "light painting." This is a type of painting which in no way requires a canvas or paintbrush. The artist uses a flashlight as their paintbrush, shining light on an object while in a dark room with an extended exposure time. This allows the artist to decide what will be seen and what will not.

Steven Erra was delivered the news of his eye disease right after completing art school. He did not let this idea of not being able to see hold him back, though, instead he dove head first into his art, making sure he used the remaining twenty years of his eyesight to the best of his abilities. Currently Erra can only see a small area that is directly in front of him. This area is blurred and everything

else simply does not exist, and is a blank canvas so to speak. As a part of The Seeing With Photography Collective he has continued his works and plans on continuing after he has gone completely blind.

Can't Buy A Thrill is the debut album from the band Steely Dan, whose line-up consists of Donald Fagen on piano, Walter Becker on bass, Jeff "Skunk" Baxter on electric guitar, Denny Dias playing guitar, Jim Hodder on the drums, and David Palmer doing the majority of lead vocals. Two well-known singles from the album are Do It Again and Reelin' In The Years. This album was released in November of 1972 and lasts about forty minutes.



Pronounced Leh-nerd Skin-nerd was released August 13, 1973 by Lynyrd Skynyrd. Lynyrd Skynyrd was made up of seven members, with three of them being lead guitarists; Gary Rossington, Allen Collins, and Ed King. Lead vocals were supplied by Ronnie Van Zant, keyboards by Billy Powell, Bob Burns played the drums, and Leon Wilkeson played the bass

guitar. The album's singles are Gimme Three Steps and the rock anthem Free Bird. The album lasts forty three minutes and contains a touch of southern rock, blues rock, and hard rock.

The Eagles released their fifth studio album *Hotel California*, on December 8, 1976. This album churned such greats as Hotel California, Life In The Fast Lane and Victim Of Love.

The Eagles are made up of Don Felder, Glenn Frey, and Joe Walsh all playing guitar and singing lead vocals, as well as Don Henley on drums and vocals, and Randy Meisner on bass and vocals. Hotel California lasts around forty five minutes and is definitely worth a listen.
