



Raider girls charge to third straight victory

The varsity girls lacrosse team picked up right where it left off on Saturday when the Raiders showed no signs of rust in a 15-5 run past Central Square. Despite a weather induced week of game cancellations the girls were quick off the mark with a 9-3 first half barrage en route to their third straight win.

Keara Patterson scored four goals with four assists for her second consecutive eight point

performance while Hailey Carroll found the back of the Red Hawk goal on four occasions. Mallori Kitts added three goals and an assist and Mckenna Chesbro scored two goals with two assists as Fulton handed Central Square its first loss in three outings.

Jordan Coulon scored twice while Olivia Coakley and Taylor Kesterke each had an assist to provide plenty of offense in front

of Kaylin Pafumi's seven save performance. Emma Robinson answered with two goals for Central Square.

The Raiders have a busy week ahead with three straight home games as they are back in action on Tuesday against Homer at 5 pm before taking on Whitesboro on Thursday and Jamesville-Dewitt on Saturday.

The boys game against Jordan-Elbridge was cancelled due to inclement weather conditions, but the Raiders will be busy this week as they host Onondaga at 6:30 pm on Tuesday before travelling to Oswego on Thursday to meet the Bucs. The winner will earn local bragging rights and the Pathfinder trophy. This will mark the third year the two teams have competed for the trophy, which was won by Oswego two years ago and is currently in possession of the Raiders, who prevailed in last year's meeting between the two sides.

April Fool's Day sting shows prevalence of predators

Children as young as 10 and as old as 14 have recently been targeted by sexual predators on the inner west coast of Florida. According to Polk County's Sheriff Grady Judd, 18 men were arrested as a part of an operation dubbed "Operation April Fools." In this operation, undercover detectives posed as young children online, and when it was time to meet up, the offenders showed up with candy and condoms. Meanwhile the detectives showed up with handcuffs and an empty backseat.

Of the 18 men arrested from this operation five were married, one was a security guard for Walt Disney World, another a SeaWorld janitor, and there was even a volunteer football coach at a Christian school. These sexual predators are all over, and can be anyone. Not

all the men's information has been released but it is clear that one man was 26, and another was only 19 years old. Many parents believe that their children are safe in these child orientated locations. However this isn't entirely true, according to a CNN investigation conducted in 2014, 35 Disney employees had been arrested for sex crimes involving children.

Sex offenders are a bigger issue than some might think, and they don't just go away once they have gone to prison. Roughly 46% of rapists who are released from prison are re-arrested within three years. This is just the percentage of cases for those who go to prison in the first place. Most adolescent offenders don't end up in very much trouble due to their age, and on average go on to commit over 300 sex crimes in their lifetime. This is huge because 23% of the

reported sexual crimes are committed by those under the age of 18.

This isn't just happening in Florida, this is happening all over the world and is an issue that is not going away any time soon. Children's online activity should be checked upon from time to time and they should always feel that they have the ability to talk to someone if they start to feel uncomfortable with certain situations.

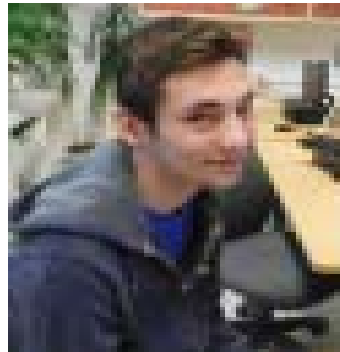

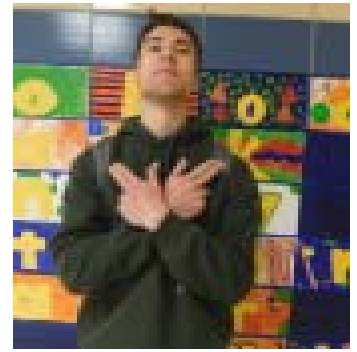
