

Raiders end CBA domination, lacrosse cruises to 15-1 record

The most successful baseball season in almost 15 years became even sweeter on Tuesday when the Red Raiders downed a long-standing nemesis in convincing fashion. Equaling the longest win streak in nine seasons with their fifth straight victory, the Raiders charged past Christian Brothers Academy in an 8-3 final.

After spotting the Brothers an early 1-0 lead, Fulton scored six of the next seven runs to improve to 11-6 overall and 6-3 in OHSL Freedom American play. And in the process the Raiders ended an eight season, 13 game stand of frustration against the boys in purple and gold with their first win over the Brothers since a 6-5 triumph in 2007. The win was especially gratifying given CBA's overall domination of the series that had seen the Brothers outscore Fulton 152-43 over the 13 game stand, an average score of 12-3.

But CBA's offense fell far short of that average on Tuesday as Bryce Guernsey scattered seven hits and five strikeouts to send the Brothers home at 7-9 overall and 4-6 in league play.

On the other side of the plate Adam Baldwin led a 10 hit Raider attack with a single and a home run to drive in three runs while Cody Green scored three runs and

reached base four times as he delivered two hits and drew a pair of walks. Koda LaBeef slapped a single and a double to bring home two more Raider runs and Charlie Alton added an RBI single to go with a double off the bat of Cole Cotton. Bryce Moore paced CBA with a pair of hits.

Fulton scored a single run in the bottom of the second inning and then added two more in the third to take the lead for good. CBA threatened with a run in the top of the fourth to make it 3-2, but that was as close as they could come as the Raiders added three runs in the fifth inning and a two run sixth put the game away.

Coach Harvey's crew will have little time to savor the victory, however, as they host Central Square today and Jordan-Elbridge on Thursday in a pair of 4:30 pm starts.

Lady Raiders overwhelm Clinton

It was a night to honor the seniors, but the underclassmen had their say on Tuesday when the Lady Raider lacrosse team closed the best regular season in school history in dominating fashion. Just hours after making their way into the New York State Class B rankings, Fulton routed Clinton 20-5 to head into the upcoming Section III playoffs

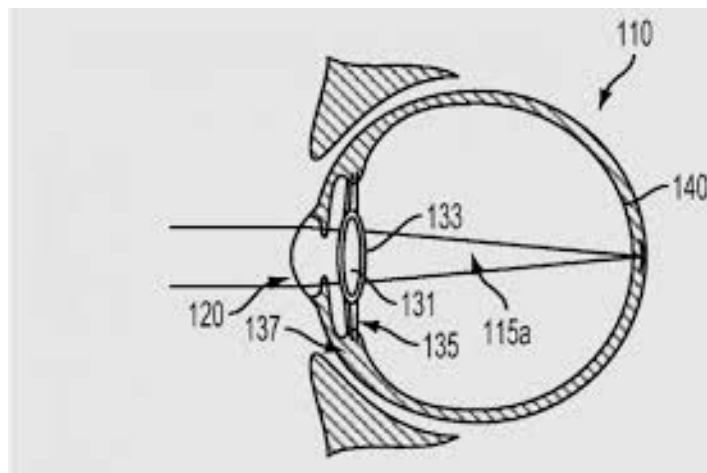
Welcome to the future: introducing cyborg lenses

at 15-1.

A 14 goal first half set the tone for the night as the #24 ranked Red Raider girls were just too much for the Warriors to handle. Sophomore Hailey Carroll surpassed 70 goals and 100 points for the season with eight goals and two assists while fellow tenth grader Mckenna Chesbro struck five times with three assists to burst past the 50 goal plateau. Carroll now has 76 goals and 37 as-

sists for 103 points and Chesbro has found the back of the opposing goal on 53 occasions while freshman Keara Patterson scored twice with three assists and has 97 points on the season.

Sophomores Jordan Coulon and Mallori Kitts contributed two goals and an assist each and senior Taylor Kesterke rounded out the scoring with a solo marker. Senior Kaylin Pafumi finished with eight saves for the

Raiders, who will now await the upcoming sectional seeding meeting where they are a likely #2 seed for the Section III Tournament. Pafumi and Kesterke were honored along with Class of 2016 teammates Gina Babcock, Olivia Coakley, Joanna Pappalardo and Paige Noel.

Blythe Owens scored three times to pace the Warriors, who dropped to 7-8 in defeat.

Raiders seek playoff momentum tonight at ES-M

The Raider lacrosse team is prepared to take on the East Syracuse-Minoa Spartans tonight at 6:30 in the regular season finale. The Raiders are coming off a tough loss against Jordan-Elbridge where they were able to battle back within one goal, but ultimately could not finish the job. ES-M is on a four game losing streak, and since their last win came against Oswego on May 3, they are itching for a victory.

Last season the ESM-Fulton matchup ended in two losses for Fulton in a 12-11 thriller and a 17-9 Spartan runaway. ES-M is a big team with a lot of strong players, including all-state football player Jeremy Perry. The 6 foot 1 inch senior weighs in at 240 pounds and overpowers his defender on his way to the cage. Perry has used this method to rack up 15 goals this season, a considerable drop from the 33 of his 2015 season, but he is still a valuable asset to the team.

Fulton has an answer for this behemoth

though, Tyler Shaw, better known as "Slaps," matches the size of Perry, and with his ability to take the ball out of the air no matter where it is it will give him an edge over Perry on the Raiders defensive end.

Connor Smith is another attackman for the Spartans, and since he is leading the team with 31 goals the Raiders will be placing senior defenseman Robbie Pollock on him to make sure he cannot get his hands free to get a shot.

The Raiders have made a switch on their man up squad, placing Shaw at the top cor-

ner, allowing him to rip shots with his long pole, which goalies are unable to track. Shaw has eight goals on the season, all against Jordan-Elbridge, with three in the first game and five in the second. This move is sure to aid the Raiders in a victory over the Spartans, so head up to Spartan stadium at 6:30 tonight to support the Raiders in their final regular season game as they seek a .500 regular season and much needed momentum heading into the upcoming Section III Tournament.
