

Raiders erupt for sixth straight victory, now 12-6

Sixes were in vogue on Wednesday when the Raider baseball team claimed its sixth straight win in overwhelming fashion with a 15-3 victory over Central Square. Taking advantage of six Red Storm errors and six walks, Fulton erupted for a pair of six run innings to improve to 12-6 overall and 6-3 in league play while hitting double figures in scoring for the sixth time this season.

The win extended Fulton's longest unbeaten streak in nine seasons while matching the 12 win total of the 2001 league champions with a chance to better that mark this afternoon against Jordan-Elbridge.

Ten different Raiders crossed the plate as the home side rallied from an early 3-0 deficit with six runs in the bottom of the second inning and six more in the third. Winning

pitcher Will Caster and Cole Cotton pounded out two run doubles to spark the Fulton uprising while Koda LaBeef registered two hits and two RBI to go with a two run single from Malcolm Wettering.

The Raiders roughed up five different Central Square pitchers for 12 hits en route to a home and home sweep as Caster beat the Red Storm for the second time this season by limiting them to six hits with a single walk. Also aiding a Fulton offense that has now outscored the opposition 62-9 in the last six games with a hit and an RBI apiece were Frank Barbagallo, Charlie Alton, Cody Green, Cameron Clark and Mike Bolster. Johnnie Reynolds led Central Square with a single and a double as the Red Storm dropped to 7-9 overall and 3-6 in league play

with the loss.

Laxmen fall at ES-M

East Syracuse-Minoa owned the second and third quarters, and that proved to be the difference on Wednesday as the Spartans doubled past the Red Raider boys lacrosse team in a 12-6 final. The two sides battled through a 2-2 first quarter standoff before ES-M powered in five goals in the second quarter and four more in the third to put the game away.

Austin Beckwith scored two goals with two assists while Tyler Shaw and Spencer Vono

had two goals apiece as the Raiders fell to 7-9 on the season. Connor Smith led the Spartans with three goals and two assists to go with two goal showings from Nathan Sturick and Alexander Regan.

Andrew Steigerwald stymied the Fulton offense with 18 saves while Brandon Batstone finished with 15 saves for the Raiders.

Fulton girls among league lax leaders

With sophomore Hailey Carroll leading the way, the Raider girls lacrosse team is well represented among the scoring leaders in Section III. Carroll currently sits atop the scoring ledger with a section best 76 goals, 10 more than Watertown's Olivia Miles in

the runner-up spot. Teammate McKenna Chesbro ranks seventh in Section III with 53 goals while freshman Keara Patterson stands second in assists with 55 helpers. Mallori Kitts and Carroll are 12th in the section with 27 assists apiece with Carthage's Braelie Kemprey topping the list with 66.

Overall the Raiders have three of the top seven scorers in Section III with Carroll's 76 goals and 27 assists for 103 points second behind Kemprey (49-66-115). Patterson

is currently fifth in scoring with 42 goals and 55 assists for 97 points and Chesbro is seventh behind 53 goals and 24 assists for 77 points.

In goal, senior Kaylin Pafumi ranks eighth in save percentage at .517 and is tied for 20th in saves with 92 stops on the season.

The Raider girls will find out their first round playoff opponent later today as the coaches will be meeting to determine the 2016 Section III Lacrosse Tournament.
